Russell Martin, Director DeGolyer Library-SMU The Rees-Jones Library of the American West

Russell L. Martin III became the director of the DeGolyer Library in 2001. His primary responsibilities include collection development and stewardship, budgeting and financial planning, general administration, and outreach to local, regional, and national constituencies. He previously worked at the American Antiquarian Society, where he held a variety of positions, including research assistant for the History of the Book in America, cataloger for the North American Imprints Program, and curator of newspapers and periodicals.

Martin earned his B.A. in English from SMU, his M.S. in Library Science from the University of Illinois, and his Ph.D. in English from the University of Virginia. He is an active member of the Bibliographical Society of America, the Texas State Historical Association, and other scholarly organizations. He is currently at work on a bibliography of Texas imprints, 1877-1900. He began his library career as an undergraduate at SMU, shelving books in Fondren Library, and he reports that he is still shelving books today.

More on the Rees-Jones Library of the American West

A major gift from Jan and Trevor D. Rees-Jones '78 will strengthen the University's reputation as a vital place for education and research related to the American West.

At the center of the couple's gift is a significant portion of the expansive Rees-Jones Collection consisting of thousands of items – including rare books, manuscripts, maps, photographs and ephemera. The donors have also committed \$25 million to establish and build the Rees-Jones Library of the American West and a \$5 million endowment to support the library and its collections.

"Donors like Jan and Trevor Rees-Jones inspire scholars to look at the past with new perspectives and to gain a deeper understanding of how the present is influenced by history," said SMU President R. Gerald Turner. "Through this generous commitment, they will further our understanding of a pivotal time in Ameri-*(continued on page 3)*

members of The Salvation Army board and the co-chairs of the Capital Campaign. He first introduced Community Relations and Development Director, Christina Cavalier. She said that The Salvation Army has twenty-one centers in six counties in north Texas. The need for the people that we serve has risen, especially in the areas of poverty, addic-tion and homelessness. She said they work through their twelve drive through food pantries, six residential centers and the children and youth programs so they can meet people where they are. They are launching the "One Army, Many Fronts" Campaign, which includes capitol projects, program expansion to meet the growing need, and an endowment component. Their goal is \$159.2 Million, and they have already secured \$132 Million to wards that goal.

Michal Powell continued the program. She said that she became involved in The Salvation Army in 2005 when they responded to the refugees from the hur-icane Katrina. The Army is the largest social service provider in this region. They have been researching the ways to best meet the needs of people in our community experiencing poverty, homelessness and addiction. The research showed that it was time to renovate their programs and a new social service campus was needed, allowing the Army to increase meeting the needs through an innovative, collaborative and holistic approach. The new campus allows the Army to partner with other nonprofits who will bring specific expertise to our clients, such as Parkland for medical and dental, Metrocare for mental health, Vogel Alcove for child care and education, DART and others. In 2019 Bob Rowland purchased twenty-one acres on I-35 at Regal Row. That was the initial gift to the Capitol Campaign. It will revolutionize the way in which Dallas cares for the most vulnerable among us.
