Steve Long, Professor of Ethics at SMU Can Ethics Be Taught?

D. Stephen Long is Cary M. Maguire University Professor of Ethics at Southern Methodist University. Previously he worked at Marquette University, Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, St. Joseph's University and Duke Divinity School. He received the PhD from Duke University and is an ordained United Methodist Minister in the Indiana Conference. He works in the intersection between theology and ethics and has published over fifty essays and sixteen books on theology and ethics including *Divine Economy*: Theology and the Market; Christian Ethics: Very Short Intro-duction; Augustinian and Ecclesial Christian Ethics: On Loving Enemies; Truth-Telling in a Post-Truth World.

He is married to Ricka. They have three children and three grandchildren.

DG's letter re amendment of MOP

October 11, 2022

District 5810 Rotarians and Rotaractors,

I want all Rotarians to be aware of an important initiative concerning our District. One of the tasks that I undertook as the District Governor Elect last Rotary year, and continued as District Governor this year, was to conduct a comprehen-sive review of our District's Manual of Procedures, or MOP. This document provides the guidelines and procedures for the operations of our District and complements the broader rules of Rotary International. This special Governor's letter is made pursuant to section 10.2 of the MOP, which governs the process for amending our MOP. Our Resolutions Committee has unanimously recommen-ded that we amend the MOP. The draft amendment accompanies this letter, [See link in eBulletin.] and the key changes are summarized below. She introduced Hillcrest H.S. Principal Florie, the Interact Sponsor Ms. Liu, and the officers of the Interact Club. PP Ley Waggoner and PP **Linda Tunnell** explained that Interact is Rotary for high school students. It was

founded at Hillcrest in 2007. They reviewed many of the Interact Club's accomplishments. The Principal, Mr. Florie reviewed the great things going on at Hillcrest. He said that the school is over capacity because students want to be there. There are fifty students on the wait-list. The teachers are going above and beyond to minimize the learning loss from the Pandemic. Their two flagship programs are International Baccalaureate and the Early College Program. They are the only high school in Dallas with both programs. Of the students in the Early College Program, sixty-two percent graduated with an Associates Degree and a High School Diploma. They also have a Career Institute which partners with some of the companies in Dallas where students can get certification in some of the trades. When they graduate, they already have a relationship with the companies, so they have a path to get a job. Hillcrest also has a Math Academy and over fifty advanced courses. This year their goal is to get more publicity for all the good things that are happening at Hillcrest. Sarah Oliai introduced Interact President Nyesha Griffin who attended Interact last year. She explained that she was nervous going to RYLA, but it was a life0changing experience. She said she still speaks to her RYLA friends and calls her RYLA counselor often. She said the first speaker changed her outlook by saying, "you are not your resume," and all the speakers were inspiring. She said she thought everyone needed to go to RYLA because it was magical. She thanked the club for the opportunity to go. She said her goal for Interact this year is to have a speaker once a month and to have a service project once a month. Susan Glen invited the Interact members to join the food packing at NTFB. Sarah Oliai explained that RCPC sends one boy and one girl to RYLA

our group determined that a broad re-write of the MOP was more appropriate than a continued piecemeal approach. Additionally, RI requires that District governing documents be updated to be consistent with the current RI governing documents after Council of Legislation changes. This approach allowed us to make the document clearer, more workable, and more internally consistent and to use the same terms, fill in gaps in multiple areas, resolve ambiguities, put certain provisions where they logically belong, and also update a host of sections to reflect how the district actually works. Thus, this proposed amendment generally affects all sections of the MOP. ...
