crats and Republicans to pass common sense agenda items in Congress. It started getting dialed up when the presidential campaign came. They realized that the most likely candidates would be Donald Trump and Joe Biden. Seventy percent of Americans wanted another choice. They started looking for another candidate to bring in if those were the candidates. The polls showed there was a very good chance of a third candidate winning. In the long run, they didn't continue because they didn't want to bring in anyone who didn't have a clear chance to win, and they didn't want to be a spoiler. They said it was fun to work on and to put together a common sense agenda. They realized they agreed on about ninety percent of it, like energy policy, immigration, etc. Those are solvable issues. When you step back and look at the presidential race, one individual participated in no debates and probably has the highest negative rating in the last thirty years. On the other side the candidate got no delegate votes and is probably the least vetted presidential candidate we have had in 150 years. When you ask how we got here, you can never predict history. One of the reasons such a wide division is starting to take place is because of what is happening in the state legislatures. If you are a young person who wants to go into public service, you really have to decide if you want to be a Republican or a Democrat. Less than twenty percent of people vote in the primaries and usually it is the most partisan voters who vote. Then the partisanship gets dialed up on social media. Then the divisions start to take place. This works well for the Republican and Democrat National Committees because they can raise money on the divisions. In Congress today there are only about thirty to fifty competitive seats. There are only six states which have a Republican and a Democrat representing the state in the Senate. A lot of the partisanship is driven by the political parties. George Washington was very concerned about the parties. The big

issue influencing elections is who will be the




