accepted. He was looking forward to the next meeting in a week.

Shawn Foster introduced our speaker today, Dr. Matthew Wilson, a political science professor at SMU, who spoke on the Mid-

Term Elections. He began by saving that the last few years have been eventful times. He said he tells his students that it is a time of change in U.S. politics. It is a month from the mid-terms, and it is the first opportunity for voters to weigh in on the 2016 elections. Donald Trump has been a different kind of President. He gave an overview of where things stand now. Now the Republicans hold a majority in the U.S. Congress. For the Democrats to take control, they need to gain twenty-three seats in the House of Representatives. The Democrats will pick up some seats in the House, but there is a big difference in predictions of how many. The seats most critically in play are suburban districts. For example, in Congressional District 32 incumbent Pete Sessions and challenger Colin Allred are in a tight battle. In the Senate change is not certain: this election cycle favors the Republicans. There

> are vulnerable Democrat incumbents in states that President Trump won. it is likely that the Republicans will hold the Senate. However, Democrats have a chance to pick up Senate seats in the West. The Democrats had ho-

ped to win in Texas and Tennessee, but these seem to be slipping away from them. There has been an enormous amount of Democrat money poured into Texas, \$38 million, the largest amount ever for a Senate race. What determines the outcome will be the relative enthusiasm to vote. Most of this year the Democrats had more excitement. In the last few weeks the Republican excitement has matched the Democrats.
