ting the shoes. Some of the other supplies were purchased with a grant from the RCPC Foundation.

A new raffle was begun this week since **Susan Glen** won last week. PP **Bill Sleeper** had the winning number, but did not win the raffle.



PP **Pam Carvey** introduced our speaker today, Russell Martin, Director of the DeGolyer Library at SMU. He explained that Trevor and

Jan Rees-Jones had donated \$30 million to create a new Library of the American West and his collection as well. The DeGolyer Library also has a collection of southwes-



tern materials. The impulse to explore the west deove the Europeans to move west. There was a great thoroughfare from east to west. Some of their rare documents of exploration are Christopher Columbus's letter in 1493, records of Cabeza de Vaca's first foot journey across America in 1589 and records of grand vioyages from Frankfurt in 1890. They also have the Texas Declaration of Independence that was signed in 1836 on Washington-on-the-Brazos. The DeGolyer Collection has a Steven F. Austin map drawn in 1835. The Rees-Jones Collection has a version of the map drawn in 1836. The two collections will work together wonderfully and will fill in some gaps. They have the Cherokee Gospel of Matthew. They have many 12.5¢ notes signed by Sam Houston. He pointed out that 12.5¢ was "real money" then. They have a history of Texas League baseball. They have an extensive collection of the visual history of the West. The Rees-Jones Collection also has many historical photos. There are also many photos of African-American families. They have a copy of The Birds of North America, by Eliot Porter, which is much less well-known that the works of Audubon. The new library will house a conservation lab to preserve old documents.



World Polio Day: One Day, One Focus, Ending Polio

The eradication of polio is one of Rotary's longest standing and most significant efforts. Along with our partners, we have helped immunize more than 2.5 billion children against polio in 122 countries.

In 1985 RI launched PolioPlus, kick starting the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. The program grew to include the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, WHO, UNICEF, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and GAVI, the Vaccine Alliance. By the end of 2020 cases o wild polio occurred in two countries worldwide.
