State Senator Nathan Johnson The Upcoming Legislative Session

Elected with bipartisan support in 2018, Senator Nathan Johnson became the first Democrat to represent Senate District 16 in three decades. It was his first ever political race. In his first two legislative sessions he passed nearly five dozen bills into law, all with bipartisan support.

He passed laws that make private health insurance more affordable, expand the scope of palliative care services, combat vape sales to minors, and bring a new tier of critical teen mental health services to Texas. He also passed legislation to overhaul construction lien law, streamline regulatory procedures, protect seniors from crime, revise counterproductive criminal penalties, improve the health of soil and water, and phase out hydrofluorocarbons, along with various bills to address the local needs of Dist 16.

Johnson played a key role in the 87th Legislature's responses to winter storm Uri, including legislation to stabilize the state's energy markets and avoid future catastrophic failures of the power grid. His work in preserving patients' rights helped bring full bipartisan support to the COVID-19 liability law. Johnson is a sought-after speaker on the economic and social aspects of Medicaid expansion.

As a member of the Senate Committees on Business & Commerce

Water, and Jurisprudence, Johnson works on policy areas that are critical to the state, including electrical power, insurance, banking, technology and telecommunications, water rights, environmental quality, and state legal systems. Johnson also was appointed to the Texas Sunset Advisory Commission, a panel of lawmakers and private citizen appointees, charged with reviewing and proposing changes to state agencies to ensure that they effectively and efficiently serve the needs of the public.

Johnson holds degrees in physics from the University of Arizona and law from the UT-Austin. He practices law in Dallas in the Trial Practice Group at Holland & Knight, and previously composed music for the classical concert stage and scored the hit television series Dragon Ball Z. Senator Johnson and his wife Anne, a Dallas appellate attorney, have three children in college and high school

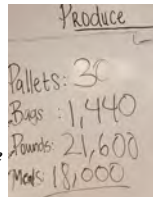


It was another Great Day at NTFB!!

Siobhan Abraham introduced our speaker today Dr. Steve Long, a professor at SMU, who spoke on "Can Ethics Be Taught?" He said that his father was a Rotarian and appreciates the work that Rotary does. He said when asked, he hesitates to say he is a theologian these days, so he says he teaches Ethics. Everyone replies, "Oh, we need more of that." He has never met a militant person against ethics. However, he says he finds it easier to teach theology. It is an older tradition with clear ideas and traditions, but there are difficulties in teaching ethics. Ethics is unlike most other disciplines taught in the university; it is primarily a practical discipline rather than a theoretical one, but teaching in a classroom almost always is associated with a theory. A student is not expected to know complex ideas which are to be taught, but students are expected to know some ideas about ethics before they take the course. The only way a university can exist is to assume there is an ethical foundation. The students are expected to have enough ethics to do what is expected of them. Learners are expected to have ethics, yet he teaches Ethics across the curriculum. So what is ethics? Is ethics a practical discipline, one which does not have just one way of doing it? Or is it a theoretical discipline, which says you must have the right theory? Aristotle believed that ethics is not about study, that more study does not make a person more moral. Ethics should make you a better human being. That conflicts with the more modern ideas of ethics which began in the nineteenth century Henry Sidgwick grew up with theology, but rejected it. Until that time ethics had always been taught in connection to another discipline; there was no such thing as Ethics as its own discipline. He wanted to make ethics a theoretical discipline. He thought "the good" was too amorphous and thought Ethics should be about "the right," which should be about voluntary actions and which would bring people together. He wanted a method to help people make better decisions. Following that there were a number of ethical theories which either focus on the result of actions or on the rules.

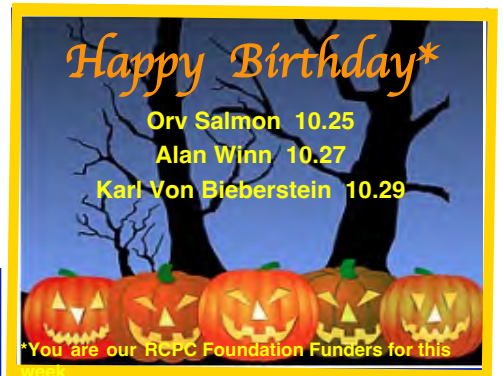
World Polio Day
