Eve Hill-Agnus has been the Dining Critic for *D Magazine* since 2015. Prior to that, she taught English and Journalism at Greenhill School for three years. She also has been a freelance writer based in Dallas. She earned degrees in English and Education from Stanford University. Her work has appeared in *The Dallas Morning News*, *D Magazine*, and the journal *Food, Culture & Society*.

She remains a contributing Food & Wine columnist for the *Los Altos Town Crier*, the Bay-Area newspaper where she stumbled into journalism by writing food articles during graduate school. Her French-American background and childhood spent in France fuel her enduring love for French food and its history. She is also obsessed with goats and cheese.

President **Paul Pirok** called the meeting to order. **Cub Amos** gave the invocation, noting that **Scott McLaughlin's** mother had passed away and that **E G McMillan** was recovering from eye surgery. Please keep them in your prayers. **John Brown** led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Banner." **Tim Keene** assisted with the introduction of our visitors and guests. **Herb Ziev** introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the Week, **Shawn Foster**, a financial advisor in the Foster Financial Group.

Daniel Drabinski introduced a new service opportunity for the holidays, Breakfast with Santa, on Sunday, December 2, organized by the Women's Auxiliary of Children's Medical Center. There will be volunteer opportunities starting at 5:00 am, and there will be several shifts throughout



the event. President **Paul** presented **William Taylor** his Blue Badge.

PP Ley Waggoner and **Stephanie Bohan** reported on Dentistry with a Heart the previous Saturday. Despite the weather, twenty volunteer dentists, hygienists, and students from Texas A&M College of Dentistry provided thirty-six patients with dental care. Nineteen of the clients were from the Salvation Army. One man even walked away with a new tooth. **PP Ley** thanked **Michael Rainwater** for his leadership on this event, and remarked that **Michael** was not here today because he was providing volunteer dental services to some veterans in Ft. Worth. President **Paul** announced World Polio Day, and said that there would be a big event in Philadelphia.

President **Paul** then read the slates of nominees for Officers and Directors for 2019-2020. The slate will be voted on at the meeting on November 30. He also announced a Fellowship Team Meeting on Mon, Oct. 29. He remarked that the Committees were more like Teams and the Chairs were the Team Leaders.

Happy Franklin introduced our speaker today, **Scott Schilling**, who spoke on "Increasing Your Personal Significance." He started by quoting, "You can get anything you want in life as long as you help other people get what they want." He also said he



likes speaking to Rotary clubs because of their service orientation. He said there are seven steps to living your legacy, not leaving your legacy. Your legacy should be what you are known for as you live. A nurse asked people on their deathbeds what their greatest regrets were. The five most often mentioned regrets were the following: 5) that they had let themselves be happier; 4) that they had stayed in touch with their friends; 3) that they had had the courage to express their feelings; 2) that they hadn't worked so hard; and 1) that they had had the courage to live a life true to themselves, not the lives others expected of them. His motto was "How can I be of service to you." He said he can control offering, but he cannot control the response. He said there are five core values, Faith or a belief in a higher power; Honesty or being upright and fair in all actions; Integrity or being whole, complete, and have a soundness of moral character; Courage or having the mind and spirit to address things head on, to face fear and push ahead; and Stewardship or being responsible for overseeing and providing. He thinks, "How you do anything is how you do everything." He said his mission is to create a community of a million people, equipping them to (cont. on pg 3)
