County Judge Clay Jenkins **Dallas County**

Since taking office in 2011, Judge Clay Lewis Jenkins has become a voice for a stronger and more welcoming North Texas. In his first three years in office, he led the responses to public health emergencies like the West Nile Virus epidemic, Ebola crisis, and natural disaster recovery from deadly tornadoes and flooding.

As founding Chair of the Enroll North Texas Coalition, he has led efforts to increase health insurance enrollment for the last eight years to improve public health and reduce the burden on taxpayers who bear the cost for uncompensated care. Beginning in early 2020, Judge Lewis Jenkins spent much of his time responding to the COVID-19 global pandemic. He was the first leader in Texas to put restrictions in place to mitigate the spread of the

virus to keep as many of our residents as safe as possible. His leadership skills and collaboration lent itself to forming key relationships with physicians, business leaders, superintendents, and clergy were key early in the pandemic.

As the Chief Elected Official of Workforce Solutions Greater Dallas, Judge Lewis Jenkins is committed to helping more residents get living wage jobs.

In this term, Judge Lewis Jenkins is committed to improving access to mental health treatment to adolescents and families by partnering with clinicians and schools to ensure much needed assessments are available.

Speaker: Shane Read, author Program: The Art and Science of Persuasion



President Jeff Sheehan called the meeting to order. PP Karl von Bieberstein gave the Invocation, and then led Spangled Banner." President Jeff

asked for Happy Bucks and introduced our visitors and guests.

PP Greg Pape introduced a video message from the Director of the CDC who spoke about the eradication of polio worldwide. PP Greg said that World Polio Day highlights efforts to make a polio-free world and honors the tireless efforts of the workers on the frontlines. In 1988 polio virus was present in 128 countries, paralyzing an estimated one thousand children a day. That was the year the global polio eradication initiative was launched. Over the past thirty-five year, remarkable progress has been made. The cases have decreased by more than 99% from more than 350,000 cases per year to less than ten cases per year. The wild polio virus continues to circulate in two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Cases of polio variants which occur when not enough children are vaccinated remain a concern throughout the world. Four million deaths are eliminated each year by childhood vaccinations. Rotary members have contributed over \$2 Billion and countless volunteer hours to protect three billion children in 122 countries from this disease. Rotary advocacy has influenced governments to contribute \$10 Billion to this effort. PolioPlus is not about raising money; it is about saving children.

spoke today on the 'Art and Science of Persuasion." He said he was going to talk about the art of persuasion, but that he would divide it into three parts. The first is



how our brain makes decisions. The second is the obstacles to communication. The third are the tools that will transform the way you communicate with others. He said when he the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star got out of law school, he tried his first case, and it was a failure. He had good facts, and he did everything he had been taught in law school, but did not win. So he decided to see what great trial lawyers did. He found out they did something completely different than what he was taaught. They knew the brain science of persuasion, and they knew how to tell a compelling story. The brain, when making complex decisions, makes mistakes. The brain is divided into two parts, the automatic, which is fast, effortless and uncontrolled, and the reflective, which is slow, effortful and controlled. The automatic brain makes most of our everyday decisions. The reflective brain is very deliberate. We could not make our every day decisions if they were all made by our reflective brains, so our automatic brains take over the reflective brain. The automatin brain is not always rational. He describe the automatic brain as Homer Simpson and the re-flective brain as Dr. Spock. One mistake our brains make is called confirmation bias. Once the brain has come an opinion about something. it looks for evidence to support its conclusion, and will disregard equally good facts that do not support the conclu-sion. How a question is framed can also ef-fect the response. It is important to know what generation your listener was born in. It is a challenge to make complex information simple enough for everyone to understand. You must find the short and simple way to understand it. It is one of the keys to persuasion.




