largest drug expansion in American history; there are sixteen million users. Opiod overdose is the leading cause of death for people under fifty. It has had such a significant effect that the average lifespan has decreased by three

years. There are 160,000,000 pills in Dallas County and billions in Texas, second only to California and Florida. Prescription opiods can be used safely for short term, monitored use, such as in palliative care, for acute trauma and after invasive surgery. When used for seven days or more opiods can become addictive. The economic costs are staggering, two percent of the GDP. It increases the costs of law enforcement, social services including foster care, and lost productive and less of a tax base. Over-availability has caused the crisis, but the legal wrangling is about who should pay for it. The manufacturers have expanded the market. Court cases have been filed against the companies and some doctors Opinions differ whether litigation is the best response to the problem, but it will not solve it. The opiod drugs include oxycodone, hydrocodone, oxymorphone, hydromorphone, tramadol, and fentanyl; they are derived from opium. The chemical effects of opiods are the same as for heroine. They block pain receptors, but the brain habituates to them and requires more or the same effect. When the levels get to high, then the person becomes addicted and experience withdrawal symptoms. They often turn to heroine to alleviate the withdrawal. Over 47,600 people died in 2017; this was 34% higher than in 2015. Some of the companies producing the drugs wanted to expand the market and were successful in convincing doctors to prescribe them for any type of pain, saying they were not addictive. They also underwrote many of the organizations that study pain management. In 2007 Purdue Pharmaceuticals pled guilty to a felony and paid \$637 million in fines, but they had made \$3 billion in profits. They moved many of their assets off shore. However, complaints have not changed. Opiods are not good for long term treatment of pain and do not alleviate pain in long term use any more than ibuprofen. After using opiods for seven days a person will become addicted and must be weaned off.
