Her second job was as a volunteer Deejay in Spain. She joined several car clubs in Spain. She then returned to live in Plano. When her two children drowned, it was difficult is to have forty percent women in leadership but she said she learned not to let tragedy destroy you. She moved to Southern California and tried different things; she really enjoyed real estate. She moved to Austin, and is now in Dallas.

Donald Carter from the Dallas RC announced the Dallas RC's Salute to American's Veterans on November 9 benefiting the USO DFW and the George Bush Institute Military Service Initiative. They are needing sponsors and volunteers.

President Jeff introduced DG Howard Templin. First his wife Ellen spoke on her charity which benefits the victims of human trafficking. DG Howard then began his "Update on District 5810." He said he had had a very informative meeting with the RCPC Board and is excited about all of the good things the club is doing. He said District Governors always talk about membership, the Foundation, and recently Public Image. He realized that membership builds the Foundation, and the Foundation sends the funds for projects, which is why we joined Rotary. Also, when you are doing local projects, you can invite non-Rotarians to participate and introduce them to Rotary. RI has been emphasizing public image quite a bit because a few years ago Rotary was a "best kept secret." The effort has made improvements in the last few years. He recommended when the club does a project, take a video and put it on the website. Also take some action still shots and put them on Facebook. Let people see the things the club is doing that they might want to be a part of. Membership is important to maintain the club. RI President Jennifer Jones is emphasizing retaining members by creating an environment where members feel valued and recognize them for the good things they do. Clubs should create a family atmosphere to retain members. DG Howard said he had set a net goal of gaining one hundred members in the District, but to accomplish that the clubs will have to attract over two hundred members. Diversity is also a focus of RI. Their goal is to have forty percent women. His goal in both the clubs and the district. Overall diversity is important also. He suggested doing a demographic study of the community and try to match the club with the community. Look for Rotarians who don't know they are yet.
