Resilience and a Hope-Filled Smile In Ukraine excerpted from Rotary Voices By Dr. Marina Theododou, president-elect of the Rotary Club of Crystal City-Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia, USA

Thousands of Ukrainian children [have been] displaced by war in Ukraine. Several Rotary clubs and individual Rotary members have stepped up to help support these Ukrainian refugees living in Poland.

In May, our club contacted the Rotary E-Club of Poland in District 2231 to learn how we could help. We collaborated over Zoom to raise funds to send 50 orphan refugees to an 11-day cultural immersion camp near Gdansk on the Baltic Sea. It cost \$575 to send one child to the camp. We were able to send 26 orphans to the camp, thanks to the generosity of Rotary members throughout District 7160 as well as several nonmembers. The E-club was able to fund the other 24.

On 27 July, our team arrived in Warsaw for a seven-day visit to build bonds with the Poland E-Club, see the camp, and visit the orphanage (cont. on pg. 3)


Program: "The Great 2023 State Fair of Texas"

first woman Chairman of the Board of the State Fair. She said it was a great experience. Big Tex was brought to the Fair in the 1950s by R. L. Thornton. He has become the mascot of the Fair. He burned down in 2012, but they realized Big Tex was a heart and soul symbol for the state of Texas. They have built a new one. She said the Mission of the Fair is straightforward. It is to celebrate all things Texan by promoting agriculture, education and community involvement through guality entertainment in a family-friendly environment. The Fair is a big non-profit with one major 24-day fundraiser. The State Fair and Fair Park have always been linked. The State Fair was founded in 1886. It has always been on that fair grounds which is now called Fair Park. Fair Park is 277 acres and is owned by the City of Dallas. It is operated by a non-profit called Fair Park First. The State Fair is only one of the tenants of Fair Park. The State Fair paid the City of Dallas \$1.55 Million in rent to go to Fair Park First. They have 2300 seasonal employees, and they are paid a living wage, beginning at \$17.82 an hour. Many of those employees come back year after year because they enjoy it. The State Fair is run by a Board of twenty voting members, with several committees. They have been going into the community and seeking more vendors. Our attendance last year was two and a half million people over twenty-four days. There are a lot more green spaces and places to sit this year. They have applied to trademark the phrase "The Most Texan Place on Earth." The three pillars of their mission are agriculture, education and community programs. They want to be one of the most impactful non-profits in North Texas. From the 2022 State Fair they have awarded more than \$4 million in philanthropic giving and more than \$8.6 million for the upkeep and historical preservation of Fair Park. The buildings were built in 1936 and are the largest collection of Art Deco buildings in the world.

'Resilience' continued from Front Page where a total of 240 children live. We visited the camp as the children were enjoying the beach. We observed them participate in sports and immersive mental health activities designed to help counter their stress as an orphan refugee and build resilience and hope

Research by Deutsche Welle shows that refugee children can carry unseen scars for life. Younger children have a chance of recovering faster. As we observed some of the older children in their early to late teens, we noticed a budding hope that safe shelter brings but also fear and uncertainty.

We visited two orphanage centers. We realized the immediate, pressing need is to help older children develop skills to navigate their immediate future, including education or vocational options. They also need practical life skills to turn sadness, fear, and uncertainty to resilience, perseverance, and hope.


