Simon Mak, BSME, MBA, PhD, Exec. Dir., SMU Cox Caruth Institute For Entrepreneurship Dallas Entrepreneurship, eSports and Crypto-currency

Dr. Simon Mak, BSME, MBA, Ph.D. is professor of practice in the department of strategy, entrepreneurship, and business economics and the executive director of the Caruth Institute for Entrepreneurship at the SMU Cox School of Business. He specializes in ideation, business model strategies and planning, and corporate entrepreneurship. Dr. Mak recently served on the Dallas Mayor's Task Force on Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Prior to joining SMU, Dr. Mak worked for Fortune 50 companies Raytheon and Digital Equipment Corporation, and then joined venture-backed software startup Mercury Interactive in Silicon Valley and moved to Texas after the company's IPO. He was then involved in his own healthcare dot.com startup and presented to top-tier venture capital firms in Silicon Valley, and then was the vice president of sales and marketing for a startup Asian business magazine, and most recently he was vice.president of marketing and business development for a Dallas-based private-equity backed Linux software company and led the sales expansion into Japan and the sale to a Japanese acquirer.

Dr. Mak is one of the leaders at SMU in researching and promoting blockchain entrepreneurship and created an MBA class on Blockchain Entrepreneurship Business Model Strate-

gies. He has traveled to London, Berlin, Malta, Kuala Lumpur, Singapore, Israel, Beijing, and Shanghai researching blockchain startups, and is the founding Faculty Advisor for the SMU Blockchain Club and the SMU Fintech Club.

Dr. Mak also researches esports entrepreneurship and is the faculty advisor for the SMU eSports Club and co-director of the newly created SMU Esports Business Certificate Program. He has traveled to London, Stockholm and Israel researching esports startups.


Dr. Mak earned his BS in Mechanical Engineering from MIT, an MBA in Finance from the SMU Cox School of Business, and a Ph.D. in Applied Science (Systems Engineering focus) from the SMU Lyle School of Engineering. Dr. Mak is also the recipient of the SMU Cox Teaching Innovation award, SMU Distinguished Community Service Award, the Rotunda Outstanding Professor Award, and the Global Educator of the Year by the Dallas Global Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Mak is the faculty advisor for SMU Intervarsity Fellowship and is also on the SMU Incubator Advisory Committee. Finally, Dr. Mak's newest area of research is space entrepreneurship.

RCPC's Collaborative Partner, Agape Clinic, is featured on the Front Page of the Dallas Morning News!

by Imelda Garcia, in Al Dia, excerpted "... Agape Clinic, one of the North Texas community clinics that offer care to hundreds of people at low cost, has seen a stream of patients who fear they have COVID-19 symptoms.

"In 2020, Agape Clinic treated 18,223 patients from underserved communities.

"The ones who get the disease diagnosed in time often can be treated for the illness before it becomes serious and take preventive measures to avoid spreading it further.

"Paul Hoffmann, executive director of Agape, said the clinic in Old East Dallas has seen a rise in visits in recent weeks because of the prevalence of coronavirus in the community.

"Yes, we have seen more young people coming in with these symptoms who didn't get the vaccine earlier, and now they have caught COVID," he said. It's sad these people who decided to not get the vaccine can fall ill now."


Program: Becoming Relentless: Profiting from Adversity



"The rise in unvaccinated young patients has led the clinic to focus on persuading people to get inoculated to avoid more deaths. Agape Clinic is not administering the vaccines because it doesn't have the refrigeration equipment to preserve them, but it helps patients find out where they can get shots.

"The Latino community trusts us. They come here when they're afraid of going somewhere else," Hoffmann said. "That's why it is important to tell them the reasons they have to get vaccinated. We have been ->
