Happy Franklin introduced speaker Judy Hoberman: "Walking on Glass Floors." Judy is the president of Selling In A Skirt (She



shared with us her acronym of "SKIRT" S: Stand out, K: Keys to success, I: Inspira-tion, R: Results, T: Time management.) and coaching programs that take the negativity out of selling. Judy shared

a bit of her past experiences of selling roofs in the 70s, in a skirt and the stigma of being a woman in the workplace. Her next venture was insurance. Where she was once again there to be a woman who could sell the business without knowing much about it. With her experiences and sense of humor on gender differences of being "Equal not Identical" in the workplace she became an award winning training director. Her fire for women to be championed in the workplace is contagious and she helps men understand and champion them. Stand up for her, and listen to her needs, and communicate. No matter the gender we all communicate differently to everyone...women to women, men to men even. Her hope was that we took away one thing that you could take, or say "I'm going to make a commitment in to do something." Without relationships there would be no success. 
