PP Tracy Gomes reported that Interact is back at Hillcrest H.S. The students are excited to have it back, and he expects a lot of them to be active. The president went to RYLA last year. He is looking for volunteers who like to work with young people.



President Jeff introduced our speaker to-day, Mark Harrison. He began by showing a video of the plans for the new facility. He said that he had visited a golf facility in

Tennessee and thought there could be a bigger and better one in Texas. He recalled the North Texas Golf Center because it was so welcoming for kids. There was no pressure to play, but kids could play and have fun. He saw some signs about how cities were using parks to build sports areas. He thought about using park land to create an urban golf center It would have a 3-par golf course and located near where other sports were played. It would be open to everyone, and there would be no charge to play. He started looking around for a place to put his golf center. Frisco was very interested. They also needed a golf course for their high schools. This was about the same time that the Cowboys were building their own facility in Frisco. So he began to think bigger and called his friend to see if he could build a bigger center, if the PGA would play there. He came to visit the site. In the next four years the PGA decided to relocate their headquarters and decided to come to Frisco. Currently, they are planning a 36-hole golf course and a 10-hole course for people who just want to learn how to play. There will be a club house with some retail space and offices for the PGA Headquarters. Omni is building the Omni PGA Frisco Resort. There will be putting greens with shops and eating places around it. There is a 660-acre campus There will be a place for kids to learn to play.

The recent detection of the vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 case in New York, USA, and isolates in several environmental samples collected in London are stark reminders that as long as polio exists anywhere, it is a threat everywhere. It also highlights the importance of vaccination as the only form of protection against polio and other vaccinepreventable diseases and the work that needs to be done in our communities to encourage the uptake of vaccines. Also, as the world gets closer to zero wild poliovirus cases, it is increasingly important to track all forms of the virus wherever they may appear, including in



excerpted from a statement by RI, August 18, 2022 polio-free regions.

The U.S. is still considered low risk for paralytic outbreaks of polio due to the high level of vaccine coverage across the population. If a child has received the entire course of vaccines, the risk of becoming paralyzed by polio is negligible. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 92.6% of children aged 24 months are fully vaccinated against polio, slightly below the 95% World Health Organization target.
