Happy Franklin introduced our speaker today, Terry Bennett, of the Institute for Digital Transformation. He began by saying that much of our leadership strategy is based on military leadership. Now, the envir-



onment has changed. We live in a VUCA environment characterized by volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity. One tweet can affect the stock market. Predictions of growth have been based on history, but now are much more difficult. Who can predict Uber or Air BNB? The world used to be predictable and competitors could catch up, but it no longer is, Ten years ago there were ten million devices attached to the Internet; today there are twenty-three billion. We are attaching everything we can just to communicate. We are interdependent. We get information very guickly, and even small organizations have access to a lot of information. We don't understand all the ramifications so we are slow to change. The world has changed and disruption has occurred in every industry. Artificial intelligence is taking the place of paralegals and junior lawvers. A company can buy a robot for about \$25,000 that will do the job of an employee. but for twenty-four hours a day. 3-D printing is changing the way industry is keeping inventory. Leadership is about speed, agility, innovation, and serving your customer. Digital disruption doesn't just disrupt markets. To be successful, a company must be nimble, adaptive, visionary and engaged.
