## Scott Ehlers

Horse Racing in Texas

Scott graduated from MacArthur High School in Irving, TX in 1994 and went on to study Finance at Stephen F. Austin Univ. in Nacogdoches, TX. While attending SFA, Scott joined the Sigma Tau Gamma fraternity. He really enjoyed his time in college and making lifelong friends in the fraternity. One of his fraternity brothers invited him to drive up to Louisiana Downs for a weekend of thoroughbred horse racing. That was Scott's first taste of the experience attending a live horse racing event and he loved it. He graduated SFA with a degree in Finance and went on to help his family open their franchise Blockbusters around the globe, while enjoying the horses when he could. He has many stories of living in Hawaii, Guam, and Florida, to name a few!

This same fraternity brother called him at one point to ask him "do you know you can get a degree in horse racing?!?". So, they discovered at that time there were 2 school choices for this degree, one being their selection of the University of Arizona in Tucson. (This city had a racetrack at that time, so this was the first choice!)

He continued his full-time work with the DRF in NYC until his mother fell ill with cancer in 2007. He quickly moved back to Dallas to help take care of his mother. The DRF has continued to be a part of his daily life and handicapping races for the magazine around the states. He has even visited most of the thoroughbred horse tracks in the states, but not quite all. He has consistently proven his handicapping skills finishing meets in the black, with an ROI of over \$2. (He can tell you more about this.) He has picked quite a few long shots to finish on top and bring in a whopping \$42.40 across the board for 1 horse/1 \race this past Tuesday at LAD (Louisiana Downs - \$26.20 win, \$11.20 place, \$5 show)

They enrolled the following year and Scott went on to earn his second degree, Bachelor of Science in the Race Track Industry Program (RTIP). During his studies, he did his required internship at the old (now torn down) Hollywood Park. He worked there under trainer Neal Drysdale's team. Neal has won two Triple Crown races – the Belmont Stakes (G1) with A.P. Indy in 1992 and the Kentucky Derby (G1) with Fusaichi Pegasus in 2000. He was inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in 2000. (copied from Wikipedia)

Scott graduated and quickly obtained a full-time position at the Daily Racing Form in 1997. He has continued working for them as a Professional Handicapper since. The DRF was sold to a business group that moved the offices from AZ to New York City. Scott was one of the few to accept the offer to move to NYC and made the long drive up with his favorite pal, a yellow lab named Chie and all of his belongings.
