Rebecca Jowers, Poiema Foundation Human Trafficking

Rebecca is the founder and executive director of The Poiema Foundation, a non-profit that fights human trafficking. She is the visionary of the organization's approach to human trafficking that focuses on: Educating communities and raising general awareness about human trafficking.; Engaging the public to be the eyes and ears in their community to identify at risk youth, and empowering survivors of human trafficking through traumainformed care so they can overcome their abuse and live with freedom and dignity.

Rebecca developed Poiema's training curriculum and is a key presenter in many of the seminars that have educated more than 15,000 people about the dangers of

human trafficking. She also designed Poiema's community awareness program where every month volunteers take posters of missing children to more than 700 locations throughout various cities. To date, this program has helped with the recovery of 250 missing minors, of which 111 were victims of human trafficking. This volunteer-led program continues to grow and has expanded nationally, operating in three states.

Rebecca was instrumental in the procurement of Poiema's safe house that has helped more than 60 survivors of human trafficking. She also developed the supporting programs for the safe house that include both operational strategies and approach to long-term, trauma-informed care for survivors' physical and mental healing.

Rebecca holds a Master's degree from Dallas Theological Seminary and a B.S. in Education from the University of Texas at El Paso. She is currently pursuing a Doctorate of Edu-cational Ministries at Dallas Theological Seminary and also serves as their As-sistant Dean of Students and Advisor to Women.

Before establishing The Poiema Foundation, Rebecca taught math and science in both public schools and at the collegiate level. She has been married to her husband, Raymond, for 30 years and they have four grown daughters.



she worked for the Associated Press in London. She was in London in 2005 when a maior international even happened there. Four suicide bombers detonated bombs on three sub-way trains and one bus. She was the lowest on the totem pole in the office. She left for work without knowing what had happened, but seeing many buses stopped with "out of service" signs. Her job that day was to call hospitals every hour. By the end of the day all of the more senior reporters went home, but she was left to answer calls from New York. Her assignment was to go out early and interview people who were terrified but who were getting on the subways anyway be-cause they had to get to work. She wrote the story and found out later that it was on the front page of eighty newspapers in the U.S. She learned how personally important report-ing could be in a crisis situation.

The jobs she got out of college during the recession were lighter, including some articles on restaurants. She decided to start writing the stories as if they were serious journalism. She wanted to be a reporter first and a food writer second. For the last ten years she has been the food writer for The Dallas Morning News. She has dines at a lot of restaurants and has interviewed all of the chefs, but is also the watchdog for the industry.

She is excite about five things about the restaurant industry. The first is that neighborhood restaurants are thriving. It makes a difference when you spend your money at a restaurant. She learned that restaurants can survive three days without cash. The second thing that is exciting is that there has never been a time with more variety of the food from restaurants. There are more vegan restaurants, as well as other types of food. The third thing is Texas barbecue. There are many good barbecue restaurants in Dallas, but the best ones are in Ft. Worth. The fourth thing is the cool restaurants in Ft. Worth, with many new restaurants. The fifth thing is Texas-made beverages, breweries and wineries.

A Moment That Changed a Rotarian's Life -excerpted from Rotary Voices, Sept. 23, 2022

A few years ago, Dean Rohrs was taking part in a polio immunization field trip in northern Nigeria, vaccinating children. After a dusty trip she arrived into the northern Nigeria countryside. She joined a Rotaractor translator, one other Rotary member, and the local polio immunization team. This is an area frequented by Boko Haram.

The whole morning, women and children came for their polio vaccinations but by the early afternoon when the women start preparing the evening meal, there were no further children to immunize. She then took the opportunity to wander through the groups of compounds. She came across a simple well with a rope and bucket and little girls, aged 10 to 12 years, filing containers, and then disappearing into the bush with their water.



I asked the head of the village where they were going. He said there were two settlements in the area, one 2 kms away and one more than 3 kms away, which had no water. These girls walked twice a day to get water for their families and never attended school. I asked the leader the costs to dig a simple well. His answer changed my life.

When she got back to her hotel, she took out her spending money and travel emergency fund and realized she had enough money, not only for one well, but to dig two wells and to rehabilitate the well she had seen that day. She left the funds in the hands of local Rotaractors and in 10 months wells had been dug in the settlements.
