Angela Hunt Dallas City Council

In 2013, Angela joined the law firm of Farrow-Gillespie & Heath, where she advises clients on a broad range of local governmental issues, including complex land use and zoning matters, economic development incentives, and general governmental relations consulting and advocacy. In 2015, she was named one of the best attorneys in Dallas by D Magazine.

Angela Hunt served four terms on the Dallas City Council, from 2005-2013, stepping down after eight years due to term limits. Elected at the age of 33, Angela was the youngest woman ever to serve and was re?elected with overwhelming support from her constituents. In 2012, the League of Women Voters of Dallas honored Angela with the Virginia MacDonald Leadership Award, which recognizes courage in working for change and inspiring leadership in others.

As the councilmember for central Dallas, Angela represented the city's largest tax base and areas of greatest growth: Downtown, Uptown, Oak Lawn, and East Dallas. She was instrumental in redevelopment throughout the area and guided many high profile rezoning cases and city?incentivized commercial development projects.

During her tenure on the council, Angela focused on improving neighborhood quality of life, expanding governmental transparency, creating a more pedestrian and bike friendly urban core, and preserving the Trinity River greenbelt as a recreational amenity.

Angela played a key role in the creation of Klyde Warren Park, a 5-acre deck park constructed over a sunken freeway, now recognized as one of the premier urban parks in America. Using creative zoning tools and pedestrian?oriented streetscape improvements, she led the effort to revitalize the deteriorating Lower Greenville area into a thriving neighborhood retail district. Together with Councilmember Scott Griggs, Angela was responsible for the creation of the Trinity Skyline Trail, a transformational 4.6-mile concrete bike path along Dallas' Trinity River that is reshaping the city's relationship to its most under-utilized natural asset.

Recognition of Angela's work includes selection as the "City's Best Councilmember" by the Dallas Observer every year of her service. In 2008, she was among 53 emerging American leaders chosen to receive the prestigious Marshall Memorial Fellowship, and in 2012, she received the inaugural "Outstanding Alumna" award from Rice University's Department of Women & Gender Studies.

Angela received her undergraduate degree from Rice University where she was a Thomas J. Watson Fellow. She received her law degree from the University of Texas and was a Member of the Order of Barristers. In addition to her continued involvement in City of Dallas issues, Angela serves on the boards of the Greater Dallas Planning Council and the Better Block Foundation. She and her husband live in East Dallas with their two young daughters.

in cyber security. He began by explaining that the internet is not secure; it was designed to be scalable and available. If the internet had been designed to



be more secure, it would have been slower and no one would want to use it. He said there were two options, either you have a computer that has been hacked or you have a computer that has been hacked but you don't know it. Current security does not protect you; if they want to get in they will. Each year is worse than the one before, and it is going to get worse before it gets better. "Malware" refers to computer viruses, worms, trojans, etc. Every second ten new forms of malware are introduced. Over 317 Million new pieces of malware were created in 2014. Seventy to eighty percent of malware are unique to the organization that created it. IT people are going from one disaster to the next - like playing whack-a-mole. There is a cyberskills shortage; there are over two hundred thousand job openings in cyber security. The global loss from cyber crime is about \$445 Billion. The cyber crime loss in the U.S. is about be wearing their blue shirts and hats 0.64% if the GDP. In the U.S. the loss could for the Fourth of July Parade.
