Bill Dendy, District Governor Update on District 5810

Born in Fort Worth, where he was raised and attended TCU, Bill is proud to be a native Texan. After meeting his wife, Katrin (Kathy) Schatz, in 1999, Bill made his home in DeSoto, where he has been an active member of the community and currently serves on the Board of Directors of the DeSoto Economic Development Corporation. Bill's daughter and grandson live in Cleburne.

Bill joined the DeSoto Rotary Club in 2002 and immediately became involved. He served the DeSoto Rotary Club in multiple capacities, including two terms as President in 2005-06 and 2010-11. After his first year as Club President, Bill took his passion for Rotary to the District level, serving three terms as Assistant Governor in 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09 and becoming a Facilitator and Out-of-District Team Leader for the Rotary International Leadership Institute (RILI) of District 5810. An avid aviator, Bill is also a member of the International Fellowship of Flying Rotarians. For the past five years, Bill has been a volunteer pilot for Challenge Air for Kids and Friends, a nationwide non-profit which helps youth with special needs build self-esteem and confidence through the experience of flight.

Bill is a construction consultant and certified project man-

agement professional with over three decades of commercial and heavy construction experience. In addition, he owns and operates a DeSoto-based infrared thermography company. Kathy, a native German, is an attorney in the Dallas office of Jackson Lewis LLP, a national labor and employment law firm, and also holds advanced degrees in cultural anthropology. Kathy is also a member of the Park Cities Rotary Club. Bill has enjoyed the privilege of visiting and networking with several Rotary clubs in Germany as an adjunct to visits with Kathy's family.

In 2011, Bill and Kathy celebrated their tenth anniversary by traveling to Nicaragua. They chose Nicaragua in part because of Kathy's love for anthropology, but mostly because of Bill's previous experience building a mission church there during the revolution in 1978. The 2011 trip included several days on an organic coffee farm in the mountains of northern Nicaragua, where communities are miles away from the closest source of electricity and sanitary drinking water. Bill and Kathy spent their anniversary evening visiting the Granada Club Rotario and immediately launched efforts to help raise funds for sanitary kitchen facilities in two Granada elementary schools. They are currently developing other service projects in the region.

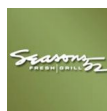
Ronald McDonald House

President **Eric Heitkamp** called the meeting to order. He remarked that reflecting on Rotary International's motto this year, he saw many "lights" among

our own members. This week he recognized **Ed Fjordbak**, who is the chair of the RCPC Foundation Committee. **Fred Speno** gave the invocation and noted that **Dennis Devenport's** mother had had a stroke. Please keep her in your prayers. PP **Karl Von Bieberstein** led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Banner." He then asked **Mari-beth Hughes** to lead the Boy Scout Oath and for all the former Scouts to join her. It looked like half of the members present were scouts! **Kendall Laughlin**, assisted by **Jeff McNaughton** with the mike, introduced our visitors and guests, including former member **Gregg Pappas**, the Editor of *Boys Life Magazine*, and **Charles Delphenis's** sister and his widow Jeanne. **Teri Thomas** announced The Hub and web advertisers in the new RCPC Marketplace. **Paul Pirok** thanked the seventy-five members who had been a part of the RCPC Fourth of July Parade, including individual thanks to many of those who performed crucial services. He concluded that it was the best parade yet. **Nolan Duck** read a Memorial Tribute to **Charles Delphenis**, then presented a copy to Jeanne.



Paul Pirok returned to introduce today's speaker, Wayne Brock, CEO of the Boy Scouts of America, to give us an update. He said that Rotary had always supported the Boy Scouts, and that he had been a

Rotarian, but now travels too much. He said that the Boy Scouts are more important than ever. He referred to an expert on raising boys, who believes that the Boy Scouts have an important role to play. In examining the mass shootings committed by boys, he believed that much of the problem is that boys don't have positive role models in their lives. He believes that Scouting can provide positive male role models, which are crucial in their lives. He said that Scouts are rising to the challenge of a changing society. The Boy Scouts have a new camp of over 10,000 acres in West Virginia, the Summit Bechtel Reserve. It will be the home of the National Jamboree, but will be a high-adventure camp the rest of the time. It has three miles of zip-line, facilities for skateboarding, rock climbing, shooting, archery, whitewater rafting, swimming and scuba, cross country biking, and challenge courses, as well as science and robotics. They still have Philmont and their other high adventure bases, and local scout camps. However, the facilities are not as important as what happens to the boys who attend; they are inspired to do their best in all things. The Boy Scout Handbook has some of the same features as the original, but has many new, modern changes. Among the new merit badges are sustainability, technology, and search and rescue. They are also translating the information into Spanish. They are also emphasizing STEM programs, and have developed a pilot program in STEM Scouting. He said that good scout troops can have many beneficial effects on boys, but that even a disorganized troop can have its positive effects. He said that the magic of wearing a uniform can erase differences and put all the boys in a troop on the same footing. A scout master who is a good leader makes each boy feel important.
