Faith Johnson, Dallas Co. District Attorney Dallas Police Force of Today

Faith Johnson is a pioneer. Her recent appointment as the first African-American female to serve as the District Attorney of Dallas County is one of Ms. Johnson's several "firsts." She has the distinction of being the first African-American female district criminal judge elected in Texas, serving as a presiding judge for 17 years, and was also the first African-American female to attain the highly regarded status of Chief Felony Prosecutor during her time in the Dallas County District Attorney's Office.

As a judge, she handled thousands of felony cases ranging from drug possession and theft to sexual assault, child abuse, and capital murder. After leaving the bench, Ms. Johnson practiced with a non-profit law firm for two years before establishing Faith Johnson & Associates, L.L.P. in 2009.

Ms. Johnson is a member of the State Bar of Texas, the

Dallas Bar Association, and the U.S. Christian Chamber of Commerce, among other professional organizations. She is secretary and a board member of The Potter's House of Dallas, and a past board member of several non-profit organizations.

In 2014, Ms. Johnson was appointed by Texas Governor Rick Perry to the Texas Public Safety Commission, where she was one of five Commissioners who oversee homeland security, border patrol, and terrorism in Texas. She served on the commission until December 2016.

Ms. Johnson received a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's in community counseling from Georgia State University, and a law degree from Texas Southern University. Originally from Atlanta, Georgia, she is the youngest of 13 children born to Benjamin and Eva Simmons.

President Pam Carvev called the meeting to order. Richard Stanford gave the invocation and noted that Barb Jeffries's



been named national football Coach of the Year. Kirk said that HP football dates back to 1923. but that now people talk about the Randy Allen Era. He took a good team and made it great; they are

the fourth winningest team in Texas and just recently win their 800th game. Kirk: Going into the 2016 season, did you know this would be a winning season? Coach RA: When HPHS had been dropped from 6A to 5A, he thought they would have a better chance. They had faced tough competition while they played 6A schools, so they had a chance to win it all. The team had good depth, with two or three players in each position, and the team had the desire to win. He said that they lost nine seniors on defense and six seniors on offense. He said he knew they would have a target on their backs this year. Kirk: Knowing that the team would be playing against good players, how do you prepare for the playoffs. Coach RA: He knew they had to adjust for speed; he told all the players that they had to take responsibility for defense. Kirk remarked that the season was decided at the last game, but it seemed like a different team came to the playoffs. Coach RA: When you lose a game, you come back with increased efforts and focus. Kirk remarked that during the playoffs the team seemed to get better and better. Coach RA: remarked that the defense stepped up and defended against good players. They lost several players to injuries, and four substitutes played critical roles. The other players had to pick up the slack, and they needed to play like a team. He told the players that most plays were decided in six seconds, so play their best for six seconds on each play.
