New Institutional Outreach Area of Service

The Club's new Institutional Outreach area of service has been established with the mission of leveraging the efforts and resources through greater collaboration with the area's businesses, institutions and notfor-profit organizations to increase the impact and profile of Rotary in Dallas and at the same time expand our club's membership.

Institutional Outreach is in the process of launching two new initiatives, in which we invite both your participation and assistance in identifying, engaging and working with businesses and organizations that have a like-minded heart for service and desire to improve our community.

Our first initiative is the establishment of a new collaborative working group, compri- tifying area businesses that might find being sed of the central Dallas-area Rotary Clubs. This group is called the Dallas Core, and the clubs involved include: Dallas (downtown), Dallas North, East Dallas, Fair Park, Park Cities, Preston Center, and Uptown. The focus has been to identify projects in which members of the various clubs can participate. Suggestions have included 1) an event at Cafe Momentum, a restaurant that

provides post-release internships for juvenile offenders, 2) a joint food-packing effort at the North Texas Food Bank; and 3) a family-oriented barbecue at one of the major Dallas parks like Klyde Warren or Tennyson. A decision for a fall project is expected soon.

The group is planning a happy hour for September 8th (6:00-8:00pm) at Fat Rabbit Kitchen and Bar, 2533 McKinney. Members of all Dallas Core clubs will be invited.

The second initiative is to develop and market membership programs for businesses and not-for profit organizations. A committee has been formed to collect information from U.S. clubs, which already have a corporate program in place. The committee is also idenassociated with RCPC beneficial to their employees. Corporate membership rates will be determined in consultation with the Board, and marketing materials will be prepared.

Regular progress updates on both initiatives will be provided to the membership.



Bartee, from Hillcrest H.S., who spoke on the Educational Renaissance. She said she had been an English teacher before becoming a principal. As a young teacher, she headed a

project to connect students at her school with students in Rwanda. She said it changed the lives of her students. They found out that they had a lot in common with the Rwandan students, but also a lot of differences in their cultures and politics. The students found out that you must know what is happening in the world. She realized that students needed to be educated to be able to know what is happening. Nothing happens in isolation, but very little that happens now is like what was happening when she started teaching thirteen years ago. Before she became an educator, she worked for Apple computer. She related sitting in a conference where they were speculating Brown announced the Ice Cream Social to be about the best plan. She realized that nobody knows all the answers, but they just get up and do the best they can. Today individuals are being put in positions to make decisions that affect thousands of people. There is a new field of how to help people who are in over their heads, who have a mismatch of what they are able to do and what the job calls for them to do. She feels it is important to prepare students to be comfortable with not knowing what's coming next; the rate of change is increasing exponentially. She said that intelligence is not fixed; that it changes over the

Late Fees, Termination, and Reinstatement

The Board hereby establishes a uniform policy and schedule for the delinquency of membership dues, with late fees, termination and reinstatement as follows:

Dues due: June 1, 1st Late fee, July 1 - \$25 2nd Late fee, Aug 1 - \$50 Termination: if dues and late fees still outstanding after Aug 31, member shall be automatically inactivated. Reinstatement: An inac-

tive member may be reinstated to full membership within 90 days after termination, provided individual clears all past dues and late fees.
