

President Jim Mills called the meeting to order. Jim

Evans gave the invocation and noted the good news

register. **Herb Burkman** reminded the club of the many benefits of the Youth Exchange, and the enriching experience that Kimberly Uymataiio had

with our club last year. Herb especially recognized Ruth Alhilali, Jim and Sherry Wolfe, and Dick and Jane Orrock, but also Highland Park H.S., Rick Amsberry, Roger Hogarth and Jim Mills. He also suggested considering hosting another Youth Exchange Student next year, and reminded everyone that their own children might be eligible, as well.

President **Jim** said that RCPC would be sending a contingent to the District Membership Seminar on Saturday, as well as sending volunteers to the Clay Shoot Benefitting Scottish Rite Hospital. **Jim** also commented that one of the senior members of the club had opined that he thought the club had lost some of its swagger; so **Jim** reminded all the members that they had much to be proud of as members of RCPC.

Eric Heitkamp introduced our speaker today, Dawson Orr, superintendent of the HP



ISD and RCPC member. He said that this is the most inclusive country in the world, and that over five million children will be attending public school in Texas. The

shadow hanging over the schools is a financial one. The last legislative session was difficult. Texas has the second largest population in the nation, and it grew by twenty-five percent in the last decade. In 2005 the Texas Supreme Court said that the Texas school finance system was unconstitutional because local districts had no access to funds beyond what the state required. The legislature responded by lowering the property tax and making up the difference with a business tax. Every district was given six cents of taxing power to use for enrichment. At that time the economy was good, so they used the state's surplus to fill the gaps. In 2009 the surplus was gone and revenues fell short, so federal stimulus funds were used to make up the difference. Now, in 2011 there are no federal funds, no state deficit, but there is a \$5 billion structural deficit, and a 170,000 student growth in enrollment. The legislature cut \$4 billion from previous levels of per pupil funding, and they cut \$1.2 billion from grants, such as those for Pre-K, remedial programs, dropout prevention, technology, etc. These cuts particularly affected districts with large numbers of economically-disadvantaged children. For the first time in sixty years the Legislature failed to fund education at the levels required by current law. In 1949 the Gilmer-Aikin Act required the state to budget for what they wanted the kids to learn. To create the current budget the legislature delayed the final payment of \$2 billion to schools so it was not counted as a part of this biennium. It assumed that there would be greater tax revenue than what is actually predicted. They also underfunded Medicaid by \$4.8 billion, and used \$3.2 billion from the Rainy Day Fund.
