Oscar Roan, Man With a Mission Chili Day at the Salvation Army

Our Speaker today is no stranger to the Sports Arenas of days Junior at SMU, he achieved All Southwest Conference status in past, or to The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Centers all across America. Today where his influence is uplifting and challenging to staff members and especially to the men on their rehabilitation programs.

The mission began while a student at South Oak Cliff H.S. and his record settings in Football, Baseball, Basketball, and Track with all-district honors in all four sports. His initial entry into big league under basketball coach John Wooden at UCLA and at SMU was temporarily interrupted by alcohol and marital problems.

This problem was solved when he met a on a mission similar to Oscar's mission today; this man pointed him to a "More Perfect Way." Resuming his studies and using his athletic abilities. As a

football and the league's newcomer of the year in basketball. In 2016 Oscar was inducted into SMU Athletic Hall of Fame.

Oscar was drafted in the third round by the Cleveland Browns in 1975 after finishing his collegiate career at SMU where he made the 1974 Time Magazine All American Football Team at right end. In his rookie year with the Browns he caught 41 passes for 463 yards and three touchdowns and was named fourth runner up for rookie of the year. During his pro football career Oscar worked in the off season with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). He retired from the pros in 1979 and became the area Director with the Dallas Chapter of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Oscar continues his on hand ministry with the staff and with the men in the Dallas Salvation Army Rehabilitation Center and in many other Centers all across the Nation.

thousand persons with food orders, clothing and toys plus special remembrances to nursing homes, etc. A rough estimate of the amount raised through the Chili Day Rotary Club sponsored project is in excess of four hundred thousand dollars.

Thus year will be Club member Bob Grossman's 47th year gathering all the ingredients for the chili: 60 pounds of beef, 40 pounds of venison, 50 pounds of chopped onions, 10 pounds of chopped garlic and just the right amount of chili peppers and other seasoning. It is then time for Bob and his trusted helpers (up until he adds the 10 pounds of garlic) to assemble and cook the chili; then about four hours later he places the cooked chili in the freezer for further seasoning before reheating and serving on Friday, December 1st, Rotary/Army Chili Day.

the holiday party online. PE John Gilchrist introduced our speaker today, Gary Thomas, CEO of the Dallas Area Rapid Tran-

saying that DART is the longest light rail system in North America. It is not constrained by mountains. rivers or large lakes, so it continues to move out of the city. They look at the mobility perspective

to provide a complete trip. You can talk about components and development, but how do you make a complete trip? A lot of young people don't want to have a car at all; it is okay for someone else to drive. There are companies like Uber, Lyft and four or five bike sharing companies in the area. On St. Patrick's Day, DART partnered with Uber and MADD to provide rides. The question becomes. How do you make these all work together? They have some "sandbox" grants which are designed to help find ways for different elements to work together. They look at the mile radius around the station, the sidewalks; is it walkable? They also look at the four to five mile radius around the station. Are there links to other transportation? They have developed the GoPass app, and have looked at what is important: time, cost, and paying for the whole trip on one app. The DART service area covers thirteen cities. Some of the areas are not in the service area, so they must contract for services.
