A Provocative Dialog: The Economy, Politics, Media and China

Dennis McCuistion is a former bank CEO who has served on over a dozen private, public and nonprofit boards including serving as Chairman of the Board and Lead Independent Director. During his career he has been a life-long educator, having served on the faculties of several graduate schools of management for financial related firms. His topics have included strategic planning, leadership, financial analysis and corporate governance. He has authored three books on the financial services industry and is a frequent speaker for corporations, associations and universities. He is a Clinical Professor of Corporate Governance and Executive Director of the Institute for Excellence in Corporate Governance at the University of Texas at Dallas.

His interest in public policy issues led to his serving as Interim CEO of the National Center for Policy Analysis in 2014. He continues there as a board member who is running the Financial Crisis Initiative. He is the host of an award-winning television program on KERA Channel 13, a position he has held since 1990. In that role, he has interviewed and facilitated thousands of important dialogues about political, economic, business and social issues of the day. He is a member of the Rotary Club of Dallas, and holds the Certified Speaking Professional designation from the National Speakers Association. He holds two degrees from SMU and an honorary doctorate from Northwood University.

This special evening meeting was called to order by President Karen Farris . Stan Carr gave the invocation. The meeting was then handed off to PP Bill

Sleeper. He introduced this meeting as honoring the living past presidents of the club and recognizing all they continue to do build this club. He said that there are twenty-three living past presidents from the last third of a century, and all but three continue to be active members of the club. Although not true in other Rotary clubs, in RCPC after their terms as president are over, they continue to serve and contribute.

He then talked about many of the years and accomplishments of the past presidents. starting with Moody Alexander (1988-89) and ending with Eric Heitkamp (2014-15)

PP Bill explained that becoming president is a tremendous commitment for four years. The requirements are to be a member

for three years, to attend one District Conference, and to chair at least one committee. He then quipped that these were among the top responsibilities of the past presidents:

- · Feign interest in the District Governor's speech on their annual


