In the 1980s and 1990s we wanted to encourage math and science in schools; what did we do? We showcased them. We talked them up. We hosted science fairs to encourage creative expression of students' everyday experience and questions of their physical realm.

So what do we do today if we want to encourage humanitarian values and high ethical standards in our schools? We host the 2nd annual Hillcrest Ethics Faire and give students the opportunity to plum the philosophical context of their lives.

Last year, as the creative brainchild of Rotarian Bill Kelly, the Park Cities Ethics Committee proposed the idea of an Ethics Faire to the Hillcrest high school faculty and administration. Journalism chair Lori Todd jumped at the idea and spearheaded a drive among the Fine Arts faculty and the Ethics Faire was born.

Rotary proposed four "themes":

- TruthHonesty
- FriendshipEquality

Students were challenged to portray one of these themes through one of the following artistic media: • Performing Arts (including music and video)

Visual Arts (drawings, painting, mixed media)

Hillcrest H.S. Students

Creative writing (prose and poetry)

The result was collage of 37 entries from a diverse cross-section of the school's student body that in and of itself was a rewarding and powerful statement. Prizes were awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place, and the winners brought to the club to present their art and beliefs.

So here we are back again. We know the values and benefits of truth, fairness and sustainable beneficial outcomes are good and positive and timeless, however, discerning them and selecting them in the midst of our hyperkinetic, celebrity-orientated, media saturated lives isn't always clear or easy.

Plano). The subject of today's program was social media and using social media to brand Rotary. Jeff reminded us we are all in charge of the Rotary brand for public awareness of

Rotary and the good work we do, as well as to attract new members. Jeff walked us down communications "history lane" reviewing how powerful radio was (and still is). When radio was a new invention, radio was "king" and radio gave us the power to communicate with a breadth of audience that was not possible before. Television as a new invention came along and for half a century has dominated media communications. Radio did not go away, but TV dominated. Computers came along ... the internet came along, email, cell phones. The latest communications media invented - social media. Social media's reach is astounding and it's global.

Rotary District 5810 has 3000 members and a Facebook page. One in ten have visited Rotary's Facebook page. Traditional media will still be a large footprint. "Old school" communications: phone calls, meetings, developing relationships are still relevant and important, but ... If we don't use social media to get our story out, we will be left behind.

We need to get out there and tell our story. · Newsrooms and papers are a business stories are based on cash flow. Do use the phone, meeting people and do develop relationships. Don't blast out press releases newsrooms get too many.

 Brand Rotary as "hip & cool" for younger people. Upload videos of our events, projects, upcoming events, speakers, meetings to Facebook. Create your club Facebook page. Your cell phone becomes "a TV station to the planet " - You Tube, etc. Viral videos are powerful in "getting the story out". Jeff's favorite truism of greatness and success is from Wayne Gretzky ("The Great One" in professional hockey): 'Don't skate to where the puck is; skate to where it's going to be.' Go to the District's Facebook page and "Like Us"!
