Britt Berrett Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital

Britt Berrett serves as president of Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Dallas, an 898-bed hospital. In addition to his role as president of the Dallas Hospital, Berrett also serves at the system level as an executive vice president of Texas Health Resources. He oversees strategic planning and operations for Texas Health Dallas, guiding the hospital in its mission to improve the health of the people in the community it serves.

While on a two-year mission in Peru, Berrett developed a great appreciation for the role that healthcare providers can play in improving the quality of life for an entire community. It is his concern for the quality of life in the community that makes him a passionate advocate for excellence in healthcare and a perfect fit for Texas Health Dallas.

Prior to joining TexasHealth Dallas, Berrett served as president and chief executive officer of Medical City, a 677-bed hospital, since April 2000. He received hid bachelor's degree in finance from Brigham Young University and his master's degree in hospital administration from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. Berrett also

received his PhD in Public Administration from the University of Texas at Dallas.

Texas Health Dallas was recognized in 2007 as a *U.S. News and World Report* Best Hospital for Digestive Disorders, Neurology and Neurosurgery, and Orthopedic specialties. TexasHealth Dallas received Magnet Recognition Program Award for excellence in nursing services from the American Nurses Credentialing Center, the nation's largest and leading nursing credentialing organization within the American Nurses Association.
