# Chancellor Lee F. Jackson The Future of the University of North Texas

Lee Jackson was appointed Chancellor of the University of North Texas System on September 1, 2002, after a 30-year career in government in Dallas and the State of Texas.

The Chancellor reports to the UNT System Board of Regents who are appointed by the Governor of Texas. Chancellor Jackson is responsible for System initiatives and policy direction, planning, and oversight for three campuses: University of North Texas (Denton), UNT Health Science Center (Fort Worth) and UNT Dallas.

Chancellor Jackson is a member of the Board of Directors of the Diabetes Health and Wellness Institute, DOWNTOWNDallas, the Dallas Citizens Council and the Dallas Education Foundation. He also serves on the board of the North Texas Regional Center for Innovation and Commercialization. He is past chairman of the

Association of Texas Colleges and Universities and the Texas Council of Public University Presidents and Chancellors.

Lee Jackson began his career in the Dallas City Manager's Office, served 10 years in the Texas House of Representatives, and was elected four times as Dallas County Judge, chief elected official in the State's second largest county.

He received many awards for regional leadership, initiated new programs in juvenile justice, air quality, and transportation, and led the opening of the Sixth Floor Museum, which has become the premiere visitor attraction in downtown Dallas.

Chancellor Jackson was born in Austin, Texas. He attended Dallas public schools, received his B.A. in Political Science from Duke University and his Masters of Public Administration from SMU.

# Happy 107th Birthday, Rotary!

23 February 1905: Rotary Club of Chicago the First of the Sixteen Clubs prior to the formation of the National Association of Rotary Clubs. First gathering, on Thursday evening, 23 February 1905 in Chicago, Illinois, U.S.A. by attorney Paul P. Harris.

Young Harris, fresh from a wild five years as a reporter, actor, cowboy, seaman, granite salesman, fruit picker and hotel clerk, five years building a successful law practice, then had an idea. It was regarding observations of success and respect which could come from organizing professional acquaintances.

More years past. He had given this much thought by the time he and Silvester Schiele walked over to Gus Loehr's office, in Room 711 that cold winter night in 1905, almost nine years from his arrival in Chicago. Several weeks later, Schiele was elected the first president of Rotary when the meeting was held in his office. Harris suggested several names, one of them being "Rotary."

ney. Bobby Majumder brought a flag from the Rotary Club of Calcutta, founded in 1919 and the oldest club in India and in Asia. Jarl Johnson introduced RCPC's



newest member Tom Dortch, whose classification is Engineering.

Jon Petersen introduced our speaker today, Britt Berrett, presi-



dent of Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital. He provided cards and asked for everyone in the audience to write their thoughts about healthcare. Healthcare is the most

complex challenge there is. The country is spending \$3 trillion for healthcare or twenty percent of the gross domestic product. Medicine is changing dramatically, and they have developed an integrated delivery system that encompasses twenty-four facilities. They are committed to exemplary care, and he remarked that a lot of surgery has become minimally invasive. He remarked that the sophistication of healthcare is mind-boggling, and a lot of surgery has become minimally invasive. He believes that cancer will be cured in our lifetimes. Currently, the primary health issue is obesity, and bariatric surgery is very common. He said with improvements in care there are new ethical dilemmas. One percent of patients account for twenty-two percent of healthcare cost. Can that continue?
