

President Pam called on the Chairs of our Christmas projects for a recap. Jerry Washam reported on the Snider Plaza Tree Lighting. He said that they hoped that this would be a bookend

cans. Orville Salmon reported that Chili Day had brought in about



\$13,000 dollars for their Christmas projects. He also said that Angel Tree would provide gifts for 50,000 children. President Pam reminded everyone about the upcoming Christmas party. President Pam introduced

our speaker today Diane Fullingim, the Chief Development Officer for Ronald McDonald House. She began by thanking RCPC

members for serving dinner to the families staying at the House. This is the thirty year anniversary of Trains at NorthPark, but they have bern at NortPark nineteen years. It is their largest fundraiser. They house about 1200 families a year, with the largest percentage of families with children being treated at Children's Medical Center or Scottish Rite Hospital. It takes \$13 Million to support their mission. Trains brings in about \$500,000 to \$600,000 every year. It is four fundraising events in one. The first is sponsorships. The biggest sponsors may designate a new building to be a part of the exhibit. The Bank of Texas is their corporate sponsor. Another fundraiser is the sale of train cars. There are boxcars, cabooses and engines, all at different prices. They are painted with your message and run on the tracks, then are returned to the donor. Tickets are sold to see the exhibit, and they also have a raffle. She then introduced Jay Rutledge who has created an app called All Aboard 360 to spread the message of Ronald McDonald House. It receives additional revenue and is a companion app to the NorthPark exhibit. It includes a scavenger hunt to complete when you visit the exhibit.
