Peavy received a B.B.A. from SMU, an M.B.A. from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, and a Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Arlington. He is a Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA), a Chartered Financial Consultant (ChFC), a Chartered Life Underwriter (CLU), and Associate Editor of the *Journal of Investing*.

President-Elect Jim Mills called our special Chili Day meeting at the Salvation Army to order. Lt. Patrick Jones of the Salvation Army gave the invocation. Lt. Jones is in charge of the center where we met.

Among our guests today were six Interact students from Hillcrest H.S., as well as their sponsor David Moliere and HHS administrator Ann McNutt.

Linda Tunnell introduced our newest

member Sibel Yuksel-Mescioglu who is a Partner in the Audit Department of KPMG.

Orville Salmon welcomed us all to the Salvation Army and introduced



our program today Major Bette Jo McDonald (and Orville's daughter) led us in singing "O Come All Ye Faithful." Major Mike McDonald, a Salvation Army bandsman for over

fifty-years played a lovely cornet solo of "Away In a Manger."

Orville introduced our speaker today, the new **Executive Director** and Chief Opera-



ting Officer of the DFW Metroplex Command of the Salvation Army, Stephen Hood. He explained that the DFW Metroplex Command

covers five counties with a combined population that is greater than in thirty-two individual states. The Salvation Army has

touched the life of about one in every fifty people. This Christmas the Salvation Army will assist about 52,000 children through the Angel Tree program. The Angel Tree at North Park alone has been able to get 6,485 "angels" adopted. He said that for every city that hosts a Super Bowl, NFL Charities donates a grant to fund a Y.E.T., a Youth Education Town or enrichment center. The center is owned and operated by a local organization, and the Salvation Army has been selected to own and operate the first North Texas Y.E.T. center. In planning for the development of the center, former Cowboy Emmett Smith has agreed to be the Chair of the Board of Advisors, in part because his first football experience took place at a Salvation Army Center in Pensacola, FL. He said he sat down with Emmett Smith and the other members of that Board, and that Emmett Smith challenged him to explain what the Salvation Army does and how it will add to the project. He said that he explained that the Salvation Army will provide hope and encouragement in a sometimes dark world. He said that last week at a Board meeting, he was reviewing the budget, recognizing they were operating at a deficit, and looking at the programs they were operating, and he overheard one of the Board Members say that in spite of it all the Salvation Army didn't run away. He said that they did not intend to run away, but to continue providing services to people who need them.

As always the food and hospitality was wonderful.

Special thanks go to Bob Grossman who has been cooking chili for RCPC Chili Day for twenty-nine years, to Robert Ellington for all the delicious desserts, to Donnie Berg, Hunter Extrodinaire, for the venison, and to Orville Salmon for arranging and hosting this very special meeting.


