Speaker: Scott Peck Program: Climate Change



President Pam Carvey called the meeting to order. Stan Carr gave the invocation. George Burrell led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Ban-

ner then helped to introduce our visitors and guests. Shawn Foster announced our Marketplace Advertiser of the week, Lynn Surls and Oldham Lumber Company. PP Greg Pape remarked that forty-four members of our club had contributed to the RI Foundation so far this year, and eleven of those have contributed one thousand dollars each. He reminded us to contribute at least one hundred dollars yearly: Every Rotarian Every Year. He explained that one of RI's goals is to promote peace. The theme this year is Peace: Making

a Difference. He then called Lynn Surls to the podium. He noted that Lynn had joined RCPC in 1989, and





was in Rotary in Terrell before that. PP Greg awarded him his sixth level Paul Harris pin. He then awarded DG Rick Amsberry his eighth level pin. DG Rick is a member of the Paul Harris Society, whose mem-

bers contribute \$1,000 yearly. PE John Gilchrist explained that the club is entering a new phase of strategic planning. He asked everyone to complete the short survey he would be send-



ing out. President Pam reci-ted that about twenty people attended the PCR Connect at Celebration Restaurant, and to plan to attend in February. She announced a food packing event with the Dallas Rotary Club in February

and a Core Happy Hour in March. President Pam then introduced our speaker today, Kevin Yard, who spoke on climate change. He began with a recent



headline, saying that New York City had sued the five major oil companies because they contribute to global warming. He said when he was doing his research, he found a comprehensive report, titled U.S. Global Research Program Climate Science Special Report. He said that i was very comprehensive and recited the results of studies by well-credentialed researchers across the globe. He said that he would report its findings The global average temperature has risen 1.8 degrees over the las one hundred and fifteen years. Sixteen of the seventeen years have been the warmest on record. Recently the U.S. Has been experiencing abnormally cold temperatures, but other parts of the world are warmer. There have been three times as many warm days as cold days. Over history, during this period temperatures have risen faster than they have previously. Ice and snow reflects heat so the loss of ice makes us warmer. Greenland is losing ice. The global average sea level has risen by about seven to eight inches since 1900. Heatwaves have become more frequent. The costs of extreme weather events since 1880 has exceeded \$1.1 Trillion. He said that the magnitude of climate change beyond the next few decades depends on the amount of greenhouse gases. The global sea level is expected to continue to rise. In 2014-15 the carbon emission growth rate slowed as economic growth became less carbon intensive. The frequency and intensity of extreme high temperatures and extreme participation are expected to continue. There are thousands of researchers studying the effects of climate change. He was asked what the solution was, and he said to use more alternative energies, reduce the reliance on coal.
