Twenty-seven members of our Hillcrest H.S. Interact Club went on a field trip to the Adult Rehabilitation Center at the Salvation Army on Thursday, January 20. Our host was long-time RCPC member Col. Orville Salmon. During the tour, the students

heard from SA officers about what the center does and how it is accomplished. The work involves taking in men who have an alcohol or chemical addiction and helping them recover and return to society as healthy, contributing members.

The history of the SA was described. Then two men spoke who had come to SA looking for help. They are now employees

of SA who help others get back to sobriety.

Then was a tour of the warehouse receiving area for donated goods. All are sorted, priced and then sent to one of the seven Metroplex area thrift stores. Sufficient funds are raised at these stores to support the rehab program with no city, state or federal funds needed. The tour was followed by lunch in the SA cafeteria.

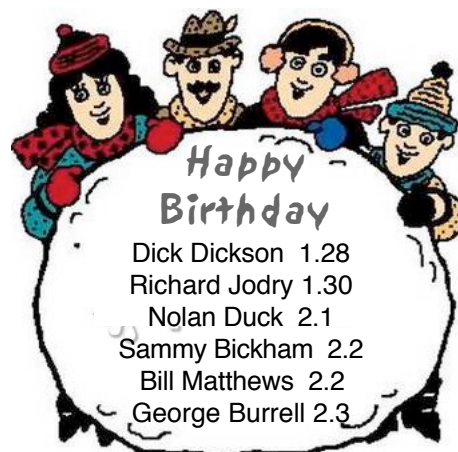
