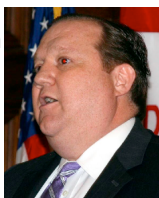

President **Karen Farris** called the meeting to order. **Nolan Duck** gave the invocation, noting that there were no members in need of special prayers today.

Karl Von Bieberstein led the Pledge of Allegiance and the "Star Spangled Banner." **Andy Carothers**, assisted by **Daniel Drabinski** with the mike, introduced our visitors and guests, which included a visiting Rotarian from Keller and University Park's Citizen of the Year for 2015, Byron Egan. **Shawn Foster** announced the Marketplace advertiser of the week.

New Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Weichel explained that the RCPC Foundation is our local foundation. It was founded in the 1960s as a legal entity for members donations. Each week five members are called on to make a voluntary contribution of \$50 dollars or more. He also reminded us that there has been a call to action – to support the North Texas Food Bank. Donations for the first half of the year will go to the Mobile Food Pantry project. He asked that members do not wait for his email to contribute, but to get their donations in



early. He also said that there has been a new fund set up specifically for the project. He

President **Karen** reminded those who have not yet paid your dues for the 2015-16 Rotary year to please do so. **Happy Franklin** introduced new member **Tim Keenan**.

PP **Cleve Clinton** introduced our speaker today, Kevin Brooks, Chief of the Felony Trial Bureau of the Dallas County District Attorney's Office, who was replacing DA Susan Hawk, was ill



Mr. Brooks began his speech by remarking that he had come into the office this morning to find out that he had been asked to speak, so he had not had a chance to prepare. He said he would try to provide some in-

sight into the DA's Office, and that he and DA Susan Hawk shared many of the same ideas for the office. He said that over the past twenty years there has not been a shift in crime, but there has been a shift in the system. In the 90s there was a "lock 'em up and throw away the key" attitude, but there was nothing done on the front end to help them when they got out to avoid going back into crime. He said drugs, alcohol or male-female relationships account for about seventy percent of criminal acts. There is a new program in the DA's Office for young offenders who have never been in trouble before and who have done something stupid; it allows the charges to be dropped if they take classes, pass drug tests, and stay out of trouble for a set period of time.

There are also programs providing counseling and drug rehab to help young offenders get back on track. DA Hawk also had a mental health program in her court when she was a judge, and she is continuing a similar program. He believes that it is the responsibility of the DA's office to enforce the law, but also help the community

Adult literacy project produces ripple effect

The inability to read or write traps millions of adults and their families in poverty, as they struggle to earn a living. In Detroit, MI, almost half of all residents over the age of sixteen are functionally illiterate. Detroit-area Rotary members are seeing ongoing benefits from a project that trains tutors and provides free reading materials to agencies tackling adult illiteracy.

The Rotary members partnered with ProLiteracy Detroit to raise money to recruit and train more tutors. Also, members have collected 261,000 books and 587 computers to donate to literacy agencies throughout the city.

Through the efforts of the volunteer tutors, more than 500 adults raised their reading levels by three grades. The project has produced benefits even beyond initial expectations. Not only do they look at reading, but also building the skills the individual will need for employment. What happened was that, through the Rotary network, these adults had access to people who knew other people who were willing to give them an opportunity. "When you teach somebody to read, ... it ripples through the community, one by one. That was our goal."
