As Highland Park High School's football team was on the verge of a second state championship in December, Coach Randy Allen remained his calm, collected self, pacing the sidelines almost hidden under the brim of a fedora. "I am too involved in what is the next play... I can't let my emotions get too far out ahead of me or show too much to the players," said Allen.

One look at Coach Allen and any Dallas Cowboys fan knows where he gets his inspiration. The fedora is a constant reminder of a man he respects on and off the field. "I read a quote by Coach Landry... It said some coaches treat winning and losing like life or death. He said, but I treat it, I'm consistent, I'm trying to be the same guy whether we win or lose."

But he hasn't always worn that hat. There was that one game he went back to the baseball cap. Highland Park lost to Lancaster High, a team that hadn't won in 12 games.

"I came to the booster club meeting. Everyone had a reason we got beat... I let them all say that and then I said, 'No, the real reason we lost is in this box' and I had a fedora in the box... I said it's because I didn't wear my fedora."

Allen coached Matthew Stafford and the Scots to their first state championship in 2005. Stafford is now the quarterback for the Detroit Lions. He played against the Cowboys this season, and Coach Allen took a prized picture with Stafford and the 2016 HP quarterback. "This was neat... The two state championship quarterbacks at Highland Park." The younger QB is John Stephen Jones, grandson of Cowboys' owner Jerry Jones. Coach Allen said he never stops to think what would Jason or Jerry do now.

In this "The Ones To Know" segment, CBS11 wanted to show something about Coach Allen that has not received much attention. CBS11 took his favorite musical instrument to the interview. The coach grabbed the guitar and started singing and playing "Johnny B. Good," by one of his favorite artists, Chuck Berry.

For now, it's Randy Allen's fame as a football coach that's being recognized beyond Highland Park. After a season in which he led Highland Park to the 5A Division I title, Randy Allen was named the 2016 Don Shula NFL High School Coach of the Year Sunday during the ESPN broadcast of the Pro Bowl.



Kirk Dooley

- Born and raised in University Park. Graduated from Highland Park High School in 1973. Lives across the street from the home where he grew up. Was honored as a HPHS Distinguished Alum in 2007.

- Studied Journalism at Texas Tech and screenwriting at San Francisco State University. While at Tech he was sports editor for the school newspaper and won the Wick Fowler Scholarship, awarded to the top college newspaper writer in Texas.

- Was managing editor of the *Park Cities News* in 1980. Then in 1981, at the age of 26, was the creator of *Park Cities People*, serving as its founding editor.

- Co-founder of Texas Taxi Limousine Service (white Cadillac convertibles with steer horns on the front). Creator of the Texas Trivia board game (more than \$1 million in retail sales in its first six months), *Las Colinas Weekly*, *Homesick Texan* and *Texas National News*.

- Oversaw all the Dallas Mavericks publications for 12 years and has published *Scots Illustrated* (the HP sports programs) for the past 21 years. He and his wife also publish the HP sports team posters displayed throughout the Park Cities.

- Published Highland Park head coach Randy Allen's book, *Coaching by The Book* in 2006.

- Has written eight books, including *The Von Erchs* and *Read My Lips* (forward by George W. Bush). His most recent book, *Respect All. Fear None. A Celebration of the 2016 Highland Park State Champions*, was published in March of 2017 and sold more than 500 copies in its first three weeks.

- For 10 years wrote a weekly column in *The Dallas Morning News* about life in the Park Cities. Last year *The DMN* discontinued its neighborhood sections, ending the Park Cities column.

- Is the Director of Youth Ministry at Christ the King Catholic Church.

- He and his wife of 32 years, Charlotte, have two children, Maggie (22) and Kellis (18).

- Is currently working on two coffee-table books: *The History of Highland Park Football* and *TEX-MEX: The History of Mexican Food in Texas*.

Shawn Foster announced our Marketplace Advertiser of the week and explained that there were some open spots for advertising on the back of The Hub.

PP **Doug Means** explained that your birthday, or anytime, is the date to contribute to the RCPC Foundation. He thanked **Dean Chance**, **Will Reppeto**, President **Pam**, PP **Tracy Gomes**, and PE **John Gilchrist** for already donating this Rotary year. Then President **Pam** then awarded Blue Badges to **Stephanie Bohan** and **Scott McLaughlin**.

Daniel Jacob introduced our speaker today, our own **Stephanie Bohan**, Executive Director of Agape Clinic. She explained that the clinic was started in a closet by late member David Baxter and his wife. Stephanie said she wanted to share some of what she has learned as Executive Director of Agape. She said the key doesn't have to do with her, but it does have to do with others and servant leadership. When she started seven years ago, there were holes in the floor and they served about 8,000 people. They were also losing about \$40,000 to \$50,000 a year, so they had searched for an Executive Director with fund raising experience. After she had gotten familiar with the books, she thought she had some ideas to raise money based on the ethnicity of the people who used the clinic most. When she asked Dr. Baxter, she reminded her that when people went to Jesus for healing, they were not asked about their ethnicity. At that time Stephanie said that she felt there was no way she could fulfill their expectations. She was challenged to look outside of herself. She asked her mentor, who shared his secret for raising money for charity: do good work, communicate effectively, and money will come. She sought out others who were committed to helping others. At this point Stephanie introduced three of her team members whom she said inspire her with their servant attitude. Agape is set to serve 17,000 patients this year. They put the work first and do good work. Others have sought them out to partner with them, schools like UT-Southwestern, Baylor, TA&MU and TWU. The students work there now or volunteer. They have increased the number of people served by six times, but the cost only by two times. Their annual operating budget is \$170,000. Half of the operating budget comes from patients; they ask for donations so that patients are more invested in their own health care.
