Beverly Levy, Dallas CASA Every Day Heroes

Beverly Levy has been the Executive Director of Dallas CASA since 1993. CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) is an organization of community volunteers, appointed by the courts, to help abused and neglected children find safe, permanent homes where they can thrive. Dallas CASA is the third oldest CASA program of more than 1,000 programs across the country.

Since coming to Dallas CASA 21 years ago, Beverly has seen the agency grow from a staff of five with 50 volunteers to a staff now of 53 with more than 700 volunteer advocates helping more than 1,700 abused children a year.

In 2000, U.S. Attorney Paul Coggins and Beverly formed a collaboration of community leaders and heads of governmental agencies to make significant, systemic changes to move children through the court system more quickly. In 2005, Beverly received the Liberty Bell Award given by the Young Lawyers Association to recognize a non lawyer for outstanding contributions that promote justice. In 2011, she was named the National CASA Outstanding CASA Program Director of the Year. In 2012, Beverly received the Women's Advocacy Award for Nonprofit Executives from Legal Aid of Northwest Texas.

Every year, more than 20,000 Dallas County children are reported abused or neglected.

What is a CASA Volunteer?

Dallas CASA volunteers are voices for abused and neglected children in court. CASA volunteers are trained and supervised to gather information and make recommendations that help judges decide the best possible outcome for children in foster care.

How CASA helps

CASA volunteers get to the know the children, review records, research information and talk to everyone involved in a child's life — social workers, attorneys, judges, parents, teachers and family members. The volunteers then make recommendations to the court that help judges decide the best permanent home for the children.

For CASA volunteers, the ultimate goal is to help ensure that all of the children in protective care find safe, permanent homes where they can thrive. Some children reunite with parents or relatives, while others make a connection with adoptive parents.

For many children, a CASA volunteer is the only constant during a frightening, uncertain time. Few volunteer roles have such a critical and immediate impact on the life of a child as that of a CASA volunteer.

New member John Whaley introduced



our speakers, Mark Duebner, Director of Aviation for Dallas and Bernard Weinstein, Associate Director of the Maguire Energy Institute and an Adjunct Professor of Business Economics in the

Cox School of Business at SMU.

Mr. Duebner is responsible for management of Dallas Love Field, Dallas Executive Airport and the City's vertiport. He explained that Love

Field is an urban airport, owned by the city of Dallas and is self supporting. Love Field was founded as an army flying field in 1917, and named after First Lt. Moss Lee Love. The present terminal opened in 1958, with 58 gates. The Wright Amendment of 1979, limited the flights from Love Field to points in Texas and later to surrounding states. The Reform Act of 2006 led to the repeal of the amendment and was approved in 2008. It will take effect in October of this year opening Love Field to nonstop interstate traffic. It will bring more iobs, more travel dollars and more Enplanements (more travelers coming and going) through Love Field and to Dallas. Challenges will include more traffic to and from Love Field as well as economic risk in new development. Some are concerned about noise levels but the newer planes have quieter engines. The Love Field Master Plan includes condensing



hangar space to use less land. The freed up land could then be put to better use.
