

Linus Wright Home Rule Effort and Effect

Linus Wright brings more than forty years of professional experience in the field of education at all levels, including UnderSecretary of Education under President Reagan. Prior to that appointment, he served as General Superintendent of the Dallas Independent School District for ten years.

Linus served as President of Ideal Learning, an educational software company (three years) and vice-president of Ray and Berndston, an executive firm (twelve years). He is a retired military officer with three years active duty in WW II and twenty-one years in the active Reserve.

He has served on the governing Boards of Austin College (twelve years) and Lubbock Christian University (ten years) and has received three honorary Doctors of Laws Degrees for his contributions to education and to the community. He served for twelve years as Vice-Chairman and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, one of the largest trust funds in the U.S.

He has been awarded the highest honor that can be granted by several organizations: Humanitarian Award by the American Council of Christians and Jews, Outstanding Citizen Award by the Dallas Historical Society, The Silver Beaver by Circle Ten Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Rotary Club, and was twice awarded one of the "Top Ten Educators" by Executive Educator magazine.

Mr. Wright is married to Joyce Vanston Wright, a retired professional counselor, and they reside in Dallas, Texas. They have four children, five grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

Home-Rule District Information

An effort has recently been launched by an outside organization to turn Dallas ISD into a home-rule district. The concept of a home-rule district was created nearly 20 years ago by the Texas Legislature, and as yet, no community has created such a district.

While the board, the administration and the community continue to examine the issue in depth, this web page will serve as a clearinghouse with factual information about the process.

Update: June 6, 2014: After a selection process and in accordance with all legal requirements, the professional staff of the District-wide Advisory Committee has named four Dallas ISD teachers and two alternates to serve on the Home Rule Charter Commission: To select the participants, the DAC 1) Defined selection criteria and drafted supplemental survey questions to evaluate applicants; 2) Reviewed 75 completed applications and pared the pool to 14 finalists; 3) Individually evaluated the finalist pool and then extensively discussed the finalists as a group; 4) Ultimately determined the participants based on the application quality and to ensure diversity in grade, race/ethnicity, and campus location.

las in 1979, and they have just completed moving into a new building. She said that to understand what CASA does, it must be understood how children come into the Child **Protective Services**



and fostercare system. People are required to report suspected child abuse. This is done anonymously. A police officer, accompanied by a Child Protective Services worker investigate every reported allegation. They question the child about what happened. In about five percent of the cases the situation is determined to be dangerous for the child to go home. However, the child can only remain in CPS custody for twentyfour hours without the approval of a judge. There is almost always drugs involved in every abusive situation, so the parent is urged to seek help. Also, many times CPS must find the father of the child. The goal is for the children to get all the help they need to recover and heal from the abusive and for the parent to get all the help they need to be a competent parent. CASA's role is in helping the children; they are in the system though no fault of their own. There are about four children per day who enter foster care. She said that about half of the children in foster care have CASA volunteers, so there is a great need for more volunteers. The volunteers are assigned to individual children to assure that their needs are met, attend court hearings, talk with their teachers, etc. The volunteers receive training, but actually assist the children with the supervision of CASA staff. Volunteering requires about fifteen to twenty hours per month, which is flexible except for some required court appointments.
