Consul Banks has also held several official capacities including President of the Consular Corps Association of Philadelphia, and Chairman of the International Committee of The Links, Inc. She is currently the President of the International Forum, Inc., member of the Mayor's Commission on African and Caribbean Affairs in Houston, and President of the United Nations Association in Houston.

In addition to international service, Consul Banks has served on several university faculties, including Washington University, Howard University, Rutgers University, Spelman College, and the Texas A&M University System. She serves as a consultant to various agencies, including the Rosa Parks Institute, U.S. Department of Education, White House Initiative on HBCUs, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, U.S. Department of Defense, Pennsylvania Department of Education, and Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission.

Consul Banks has also received numerous awards for humanitarian service and civil rights advocacy.

U.S. Rotarian Opens School for Girls in her Native Afghanistan

In 2005 U.S. Rotarian Razia Jan came up with a dangerous idea: to start a free private school for girls in her native Afghanstan. The Taliban were using extreme violence to keep girls from learning. In 2008, the year she opened the school, terrorists in the country, armed with bombs, poison gas, guns, grenades, and acid, killed 149 teachers, students, and employees in Afghan schools.

Jan did not intend to let terrorists stop her. She approached Afghan Ministry of Education officials and persuaded them to

Without the school, many of the students never would have had the chance to receive an education. "I can feel a change happening in these girls and in this community," says Jan, who moved back to Afghanistan after building a successful tailoring business in Duxbury, *(cont. on pg. 3)*

mote reading through recognizing Dr. Seuss's birthday. She said volunteers are always needed in the schools to read to children or to tutor.

Chad Harbour introduced our speaker

today, Bob Ferguson, Director of TDIndustries, on "Servant

Leadership." He said that TDI is an employee-owned company; there are 1850 partners and it has revenues of \$480M. It has been listed

on Fortune Magazine's list of the best companies to work for every year since the list was started. He noted that there had been many changes since the company was founded in 1946. He said that in a borderless world and economy everyone loses the protection of distance and time, and that it won't matter where work is done; this results in more opportunities and threats. He also noted that technological innovation was occurring faster and faster. While many people resist change; change has increased productivity. He said the company builds buildings and like construction, companies must have a good foundation. Companies who put their employees first have happy customers. His company adopted the principles of servant leadership. In order to have trust there must be both competence and character. The more trust he finds in any endeavor, the more he gets things done. Studies have shown that the higher the trust, the lower the cost of projects. He said, too, that the stocks of those companies which are voted as good places to work by their employees, compare favorably to the Dow-Jones average. In servant leadership you have to be a servant first; you have to grow the people. There is value in differences and strength in diversity. He said whatever is new requires new mind sets, skill sets and tool sets. Once you get servant leadership and trust, then many potential difficulties are resolved.
