When I was asked to judge our school's first Ethics Fair in mid-February, I was skeptical of the student turnout. After reviewing the first entry – a song written, sung and recorded by a student – I was utterly blown away. The next two hours of reading poems and essays; watching dances, and critiquing photography and artwork left me amazed at the depth and profoundness of the entries. Not only did many students participate, but they clearly took time and effort to creatively express their thoughts concerning equality, friendship, truth and honesty.

This event was a major success in my eyes, and Hillcrest will hopefully make this special event a tradition.

The first Hillcrest Ethics Fair received close to 40 submissions.

Hillcrest HS in conjunction with Park Cities Rotary Club held its first annual Ethics Faire, Wednesday, February 16th. The creation of **Bill Kelly**, the Ethics Faire is an opportunity for students express their experience of ethics in their everyday lives.

The themes for this year's faire were loosely based on the 4-way test: Truth, Friendship, Honesty, Equality. Students were invited to express one of the themes in one of three categories: Visual Arts, Performing Arts, or Writing (Poetry or Prose).

Thirty-seven entries were submitted and were judged by a nine member panel that included Rotarians **Herb Burkman** (Ethics chair), **Jina McDaniel** (former Hillcrest Alum) and PP **Ley Waggoner**.

The action group consists of Rotarians dedicated to helping Rotary clubs carry out significant water and sanitation projects. By collaborating with this group and other organizations that

A focus on water

Billions of people lack access to safe drinking water and proper sanitation. Rotarians are involved in projects worldwide, from building mechanized water systems to teaching better hygiene.

The effort is part of the International H2O Collaboration, an alliance between Rotary International and USAID. Launched in 2009, it works to implement long-term, sustainable water, sanitation, and hygiene projects in the developing world. The first phase of the partnership has focused on three countries: Ghana, the Philippines, and the Dominican Republic.

"With this collaboration, Rotary is taking the commitment to clean water and sanitation to the next level," says RI Vice President Thomas M. Thorfinnson, a member of the RI/USAID Steering Committee. "We're not just focused on simply providing safe drinking water and walking away. We are looking at our ability to

partner to make a larger impact in a bigger part of the world through sustainable projects and clean sanitation practices."

The International H2O Collaboration is an example of Rotary's dedication to water and sanitation issues, a focus under The Rotary Foundation's Future Vision Plan.
