Erle Nye is chairman emeritus of TXU Corp. His experience has been in the engineering, financial, legal, operations, and regulatory areas of the energy industry.

Nye served as Chairman of the Board of the Edison Electric Institute and co-chaired the CEO Task Force on Critical Infrastructure Protection. He is past chairman of the Board of Directors of the Electric Power Research Institute, North American Electric Reliability Council, the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, and the Nuclear Energy Institute. Nye was appointed Chairman of the National Infrastructure Advisory Council by President George Bush. Nye served on the Advisory Committee to the President's Commission on Critical Infrastructure Protection and on the U. S. Department of Energy's Electric System Reliability Task Force. Nye is a registered professional engineer and a member of local, state, and American bar associations.

Nye holds a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering from Texas A&M U., a J.D. from SMU, and a Doctor of Science, Honoris Causa from the Baylor College of Dentistry. He was appointed by Governor George Bush, in February, 1997, to serve a six-year term on The Texas A&M System Board of Regents and

was elected as Chairman of the Board of Regents in May 2001. He was reappointed as a Regent in 2003 by Governor Rick Perry, serving through April 2009.

Nye is past chairman of the Texas A&M College of Engineering Advisory Council. He also serves on the Texas A&M Health Science Center Foundation Board and is a member of The Chancellor's Century Council of the Texas A&M University System.

Nye is a member of the Development Council of the U. of Texas at Dallas. For SMU, Nye serves on the Executive Boards for the Cox School of Business and the Dedman School of Law, the Tate Lecture Series, and serves on the Executive Advisory Council of the Maguire Center for Ethics and Public Responsibility. He was formerly Chairman of the Board of Baylor College of Dentistry. In 2005, Nye was appointed to the Board of the U. of Texas Investment Management Company (UTIMCO) and Chair of its Audit and Ethics Committee. He was elected Chair of UTIMCO in Feb. 2009, serving until April 2010.

He serves on the boards of The Trinity Trust Foundation, The Women's Museum, The Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, and chairs North Texas Public Broadcasting, Inc. Nye is

Ed Fjordbak introduced our speaker today, Mary Brinegar President of The Arboretum. She said that this is *your* garden. She also ex-



plained that Dallas wants things that are "world class," and that The Arboretum is world class. They will be featured on "Good Morning, America," and they have been listed by MSN as one of the Ten Things You Have To Do in

America in the Spring. The Arboretum has also been listed among the Fourteen Best Gardens in the World. Southern Living also has recognized The Arboretum. They are just ending Dallas Blooms, but have a wonderful exhibit in the fall, as well. They have just opened the Red Maple Rill with two hundred great maples. She said that she had been overseeing the installation of the Chihuly Exhibition, and that it had had to be insured for \$22 million. There will be twenty-three different spots in the garden that will have Chihuly sculptures. The Chihuly Exhibit brought in 700 to 900 thousand guests when it was shown in Missouri, and the Cox Business School has estimated that the exhibit will bring between \$145 and 170 million to the Dallas economy. She recommended coming to a concert on Tuesday or Thursday night and to view the Chihuly glass lighted at night. The Arboretum has three parts to its mission: to have a credible botanical display, to return to the field which they do through their plant trial program, and to educate adults and children. The Arboretum is leading the world in educational programs among the large gardens of the world. They have dedicated eight acres to a new children's educational garden, with a nationally recognized curriculum. The Children's Garden will open in April of 2013. She brought a video to show some of the plans; it will be the only garden like it in the world, and its progress is being tracked by Newsweek.
