## Marlan W Downey, Roxanna Oil Black Gold – Texas Tea

Marlan W Downey had a thirty-year career with Shell Oil in management and research, retiring as President of Pecten (Shell) International in 1987. After a brief retirement, during which he founded Roxanna Oil, he joined Atlantic Richfield and served for seven years as President of Arco International. After retiring from Arco in 1996, he became Bartell Professor of Geoscience at the University of Oklahoma, and Chief Scientist at the Sarkeys Energy Center.

Marlan is a former President of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists. He is an elected Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a Senior Fellow of the Institute for Study of Earth and Man at SMU, and a fellow of the Geological Society of the United Kingdom.

In 1987, Marlan was knighted by President Biya of Cameroon for his services to that country.

He has been honored by the world's largest geological society as "A Living Legend in the Oil and Gas Business", served as AAPG Distinguished Lecturer, Exxon Distinguished Lecturer to Australia, and Huffington Distinguished Lecturer for Southeast

Asia. In 2000, he organized and chaired the Presidential Energy Policy Symposium in Washington, DC, bringing together the presidents of all the professional energy societies in the USA. In 2002, Marlan received the R H Dott award for best geologic publication, and in 2003 received the Hedberg Medal for his distinguished international scientific service. In 2005, he was honored as a "Legendary Oil Finder" by the Petroleum History Foundation. In 2009 he received the Sydney Powers Medal for outstanding scientific achievements, the highest award given by the world's largest geological group.

In the past two years, Marlan has been invited by governments in Israel, China, Dubai, and the United Kingdom to provide advice for the development of more efficient energy sources.

Marlan lives in Dallas, Houston, and in Cadgwith, Cornwall, with his wife Marea. He serves in numerous professional and charitable groups, including Berkeley Earth. He is active as a consultant, is an advisor to the boards of Foundation Energy, TransAtlantic, Matador Resources, and is Chairman of Roxanna Oil, Houston, a company owned by his six children.

The Mayor of Rockwall introduced our speaker today. Steve

Blow, columnist for The Dallas Morning News, who spoke on civil discourse. He said that Cleve had asked him to speak after reading his column on civility. He recounted going on an assignment to travel along the Rio Grande and visiting cafes in small towns where there was always a "table of wisdom," older men discussing the events of the day. He took the same trip twenty-five years later. but politics and current events were no longer discussed. He realized that there was a problem. People should be able to discuss serious issues; comparing your views makes understanding better. At one talk he gave he was asked what he thought was the primary threat to young people. After some thought, he said it was intolerance. There are countries where intolerance is a way of life, but in out country tolerance allows us to get along. In our country we celebrate our differences. Two parent households demonstrate two parent wisdom: two heads are better than one. In forming committees it is useful to find different kinds of people; their different experiences lead to better results. A study has shown that Liberals and Conservatives have different ways of thinking and processing information, but one is not better than another. God made us all different so that we may learn from each other. Everyone has blinds spots, and discussions with others help to overcome them. Discussion should not be about who wins and who loses. Compromise is important for marriages and for work. There is truth on both sides of any argument. It is important to be able to have civil debate and part as friends. He remarked that his book, Choosing Civility, really is on things we should have learned in Kindergarten. He
