President Eric Heitkamp called the meeting to order. Stan Carr gave the invocation and recognized all the club's veterans in honor of He also noted that Cindv

Cummings would be starting chemotherapy. Please keep her in your prayers. Philip Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance and the "Star Spangled Banner." Richard Stanford, assisted by Margaret Collins with the mike, introduced our visitors and quests, including former member John Gilchrist and several Interactors needing summer jobs. Teri Thomas announced the Marketplace advertiser of the week. President Eric announced that the District Awards would be announced in August this year, but that they were preparing the entries now. President Eric then turned the program over to VP Tracy Gomes to discuss "engagement" and plans for the future.

VP Tracy began by remarking on RCPC's history of service, and asking how to move forward and remain relevant. To do so, they are looking at "Rotary 2020." RCPC was "Club of the

Year" in 2009 thru 2013, but when you are on top is the time to think again; will RCPC be relevant in 2020? He explained that all organizations go through a "relevance curve": it starts and starts to grow. turning point, either a crisis or an opportunity. To improve again, you must ask guestions: Who are we? What makes us great? Where do we fit? He then asked where RCPC was on the relevance curve. What will we be known for? Will people want to join? Where do we fit? The Board is continuing strategic planning with the goal to continually advance our club through forward thinking and planning to adapt to changing environments.

President **Eric** reviewed their strategic Armed Forces Day on May 16. priorities: (1) to engage current members and attract new members through service, fellowship and networking; (2) to enhance club impact and community awareness through collaborative partnerships; and (3) to address hunger with an emphasis on childhood nutrition and education.

> Kathleen Klaviter, who has assisted in the strategic planning process, stated that to continually develop our club, we want to identify a set of core values to use as guiding principles.

She explained that we, as a club, embody core values; they support our vision and strategic priorities. She suggested these as some of our values: accountability, commitment, having fun, being open minded, innovation, and integrity.

PE Karen Farris said that they are trying to put in place an infrastructure that will serve the club well into the future. They have identified three year goals and one year

goals in the areas of membership, collaborative partnerships and children's nutrition.

PP Jim Mills ended the program with a reminder that the July 4th Parade is only 43 days away and the plans for the Parade. Members will be receiving new shirts and hats to help identify us to the public.
