# Arthur P. Bollon, PhD Artificial Blood and Personalized Medicine

rt Bollon, PhD, has more than thirty years of experience in biotechnology as a scientist, company executive, and entrepreneur. He is the Co-founder, Chairman and CEO of Vitruvian BioMedical, Inc. While the initial focus of the company was Alzheimer Disease, their research interests include bridging traditional and molecular diagnostics and treatment.

TODAY'S PROGRAM

Art is the co-founder of HemoBioTech, Inc. which focuses on a red blood substitute derived from modified bovine hemoglobin, which is advancing toward clinical trials in the U.S. Although no longer the President and CEO of HemoBioTech, he remains a Director and Consultant to the company.

He co-founded SignPath Pharmaceuticals in 2006, and remains a Director. The company focuses on Curcumin, a plant derivative for the treatment of cancer and neuro-degenerative diseases, and is planning clinical trials in oncology for late 2010 or early 2011.

He co-founded Cytoclonal Pharmaceutics in 1992 and was Chalrman and CEO until 2001. The company acquired drug design technology based on the Nobel Prize winning work of Dr. John Pople, who served as a scientific advisor. The company focused on cancer diagnostic technology using DNA probes and Monoclonal Antibodies. Cytoclonal was in a business agreement with Bristol Meyers Squibb for the cancer-fighting drug, Taxol.

Prior to 1992 Art founded and was Chairman and CEO of Wadley Biosciences ectors of TITAS, a Dallas arts group pre-

Petroleum and Wadley Cancer Center. The company focused on Cytokine technology for cancer treatment.

From 1979 through 1987 Art served as Chairman of the department of Molecular Genetics and Director of Genetic Engineering at the Wadley Cancer Center.

From 1972 through 1979 he was an Assistant Professor at UT Health Science Center at Dallas, and from 1983 through 1989 was an Adjunct Professor at the University of Texas at Dallas.

Art received his PhD in Molecular Genetics from Rutgers University and was a post-doctoral fellow at Yale University.

He is also interested in art, music and the martial arts. He is on the Board of Dir-/LPL, which was in partnership with Phillips senting global music and dance companies




President Rick Amsberry called the meeting to order. Margaret Collins gave the invo-

#### A Story for Memorial Day

Several weeks ago in Atlanta , GA, in the airport, several people witnessed a great act of patriotism.

Moving through the terminal was a group of soldiers in their camos. As they began heading to their gate, everyone (well almost everyone) was abruptly to their feet with their hands waving and cheering these young unsung heroes who are putting their lives on the line everyday for us so we can go to school, work and home without fear or reprisal.

A young girl, not more than 6 or 7 years old, ran up to one of the male soldiers. He kneeled down and said 'hi.' The little girl then asked him if he would give something to her daddy for her.

The young soldier, who didn't look any older than maybe 22 himself, said he would try and what did she want to give to her Daddy. Then suddenly the little girl grabbed the neck of this soldier, gave him the biggest hug she could muster and then kissed him on the cheek.

The mother of the little girl told the young soldier that her husband was a Marine and had been in Iraq for 11 months. As the mom was

explaining how much her daughter missed her father, the young soldier began to tear up.

When this temporarily single mom was done explaining her situation, all of the soldiers huddled together for a brief second. Then one of the other servicemen pulled out a military-looking walkie-talkie. They started playing with the device and talking back and forth on it.

After about 10-15 seconds of this, the young soldier walked back over to Courtney, bent down and said this to her, 'I spoke to your daddy and he told me to give this to you.' He then hugged this little girl that he had just met and gave her a kiss on the cheek. He finished by saying 'your daddy told me to tell you that he loves you more than anything and he is coming home very soon.'

The mom at this point was crying and as the young soldier stood to his feet, he saluted Courtney and her mom. As the soldiers began to leave, heading towards their gate, people resumed their applause.
