How a Global Grant Helped People in Ecuador

Rotary members in California began helping poor communities in Ecuador through microcredit loans several years ago. When the Rotary Club of Marin Evening decided to take on a global grant project, it partnered with a microcredit organization in the province of Esmeraldas to extend its impact. They got other clubs involved to offer many more poor women small loans and training that will help them expand their businesses.

Most of the global grant, including \$75,000 from The Rotary Foundation, is providing seed money for microloans, but it's also buying sewing and baking equipment for a training center established to teach loan recipients vocational skills and basic business management.

One woman had started a business with an old hand-operated sewing machine. With her first loan, she bought an electric sewing machine that enabled her to make items faster.
