Larry M. James Dallas Homeless: Tent City

From August 1994 until the present, Larry James has provided Force and co-chair with Mayor Rawlings of Neighbor Up's Collectries), most recently as CEO. CitySquare, a faith-based, human and community development corporation, battles the causes and effects of poverty through service, advocacy and friendship.

A graduate of Harding University (BA 1972), Harding School of Theology (MA 1973), New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary (MDiv 1977), Tulane University (MA-American History 1986) and Perkins School of Theology at SMU (post graduate studies), James has been involved in developing and implementing holistic, justice-focused approaches to congregational and community service and outreach throughout his career. James' popular book, The Wealth of the Poor: How Valuing Every Neighbor Restores Hope in Our Cities (ACU Press, 2013), provides a personal memoir and commentary on his approach to urban community development. James, a minister, is a member of the ministerial staff at Highland Park United Methodist Church in Dallas.

James served as chair of former Mayor Tom Leppert's Work Group on Housing, chair of Mayor Mike Rawlings' Poverty Task

executive leadership for CitySquare (formerly Central Dallas Minis- tive Impact Leadership Council that directs targeted work in Southern Dallas as a part of the mayor's GrowSouth initiative. Recently, DMagazine CEO named James one of the 500 most powerful business leaders in Dallas-Fort Worth.

> CitySquare delivers compassion, education, medical care, legal services, technical training, youth and children's ministry, affordable workforce housing, work force development and technology training initiatives, housing interventions for homeless persons and spiritual development to neighbors living in the tough inner city communities of East and South Dallas. In addition to Dallas, the work of *CitySquare* has expanded into Houston, Ft. Worth, Waco, Kaufman and Austin, Texas, and most recently into Denver, Colorado.

James, a Richardson native, is married to the former Brenda Erwin. The couple has two grown daughters and four grandchildren. Since 1999, Larry and Brenda have lived in inner city East Dallas.



Service. It is self-funded with ninety percent coming from Roger Staubach. In 2012 he started placing veterans in jobs. Nationally, only about half of the returning veterans find jobs within a year. The divorce rate for returning veterans is about sixty-five percent, and about five percent commit suicide. The factor that reduces these statistics by fifty to seventy-five percent is getting a job. Working enhances dignity, respect and being a meaningful part of the community. Fundamentally, jobs help vets. Veterans have talent, leadership skills, discipline, commitment, and an attitude you cannot create. Veterans make excellent employees. However, it is not always easy for veterans to reenter the workforce; it is a different culture. The military is mission driven, but business is less predictable. It is imporwith a Rotary Club there to continue the project tant that veterans perform well on the job, so Allies in Service provide mentoring. They also teach them how to write résumés, help them get professional clothes, practice mock interviews and help match the veterans' skills to the jobs. Now seventy-five percent of their clients receive job offers. (continued on page 3)
