

Under her leadership, NTFB has experienced exceptional growth—and today provides access to 175,000 meals to hungry North Texans each day. Under Jan's leadership, the North Texas Food Bank is embarking on a strategic plan to improve the quality of life in North Texas by eliminating the hunger gap by 2023. Susan Harris introduced our speaker today, Bruce Bradford, President and CEO of the North Dallas Chamber of Commerce. He spoke on the Dallas Midtown Redevelopment Plan. First, he reviewed some of

the accomplishments of the North Dallas Chamber since it was founded in the 1950s. The work on 635 will be finished next year; they are looking at the area just north of 635 between Valley View



Mall and The Galleria. The Chamber has worked with Linda Koop on the Dallas City Council to get an Economic Development grant from the city as a part of the project. The Galleria and Valley View Mall are \$3 Billion development. Their goal is twenty-two million square feet of new development, worth \$14 Billion. They are considering a mixed-use development with no massive parking lots. It will require area-wide rezoning, but there will be subdistricts, each of which will have minimum and maximum building heights. There will also be a twenty-five acre commons area. However, nothing will happen right away; they are considering a bond package in 1916-17. There will be no tax dollars spent on the project. It will be publicly accessible, but privately maintained. They will also be adding streets within the area, but as developers come in, they will have ideas for where the streets will go; they are also looking at a DART connection. He believes that this is a transformational opportunity for North Dallas.
