Small Loans Make a Big Difference

By offering small loans to entrepreneurs, particularly women, in impoverished regions, Rotarians promote economic and community development.

The Rotary Club of Alexandria Sporting, Egypt, rose to the challenge by focusing on microcredit loans, literacy classes, and a sewing workshop to meet the needs of low income community members, helping women in particular to start businesses and learn useful work skills.

We gave loans to deprived women supporting large families," says past club president Heba Kabel. Club members made loans of about US\$85 to twenty entrepreneurs to launch small food or cleaning businesses. The loans were paid back in installments over the course of a



year, and the money was then loaned out again, turning the club's initial investment of about \$1,700 into a sustainable microcredit program.

Rotarians will help improve the delivery of vital health care in West Africa through a new strategic partnership between The RI Foundation and the global charity Mercy Ships

Through the partnership, the Foundation will offer packaged global grants for Rotary clubs and districts to assemble training teams of medical professionals. These teams will perform or assist in lifechanging surgeries.

cation presented by Lisa Amsberry. Song leader Bill Matthews led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled



Chair of the Day **Jon Petersen** introduced
Robert Williams, DDS. Dr.
Williams is a forensic odontologist. He immediately
explained just what that is,

which is a dentist who is able to identify

deceased people by their dental records. He explained that the State of Texas requires a positive ID of any deceased person, and sometimes there is no oth-



er way to identify a person except for their dental records. Many times a person's neighbors don't really know the deceased's real name, date of birth or relatives. He also explained that DNA cannot match a victim if you don't know who he or she is, their blood relatives, or if there is a DNA sample in the database. If they did not commit a crime, most likely there is no DNA available. His program was enhanced by some very "interesting" photographs of some crime victims, with several that showed bite marks on the body. He went on to explain that he often has to match bite marks to the perpetrator's teeth in criminal prosecutions. He also explained that much of what we see on television shows like CSI is simply not realistic. Most body identification is not as neat, nor as easy, as it appears on most crime shows. The meeting was wrapped up with Mary Bishop leading the Four-Way Test and Jim Mills adjourning.




