# **HPISD Schools Renovations**



Ed Levine is the new HPISD Executive Director of Construction Services. He joined the district on June 27, and his responsibilities will include planning and development, implementation, coordination and oversight of district construction projects.

Levine comes to HPISD from Dallas ISD where he served as Executive Director of Construction Services for the last five

years. He was responsible for managing the \$1.3 billion 2008 Bond Program and implementing the \$1.6 billion 2015 Bond Program. Prior to joining Dallas ISD, Levine spent nearly 30 years with the City of Dallas, most recently serving as the Building Official, managing all aspects of the development process and more than 200 staff members.

Levine earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Bachelor of Architecture degree from McGill University in Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Levine has been married for 29 years to Jamie, a commercial interior designer for hospital environments. They live in Coppell, and have two children. Lauren is in the process of applying for a PhD in creative writing, and Alex is a senior in the Price College of Business at the University of Oklahoma.
