Project Promotes Literacy for Social Change in South Africa

A staggering two million illiterate adults live throughout KwaZulu-Natal Province in South Africa. They face poverty, frequent water shortages and prevalent HIV.

Rotarians are helping to confront these challenges with an innovative literacy effort, arming adults with the ability to read and write while providing lessons in nutrition and health, food sustainability, and basic business skills.

The Adult Literacy Projects - known as KwaNibela and KwaJobe – arose from a partnership among Rotary districts 9270 (South Africa) and 7950 (Rhode Island and Massachusetts), Operation Upgrade, and the International Reading Association. The projects teaches men and women to read and write so they can participate in the economy and politics of their country.
