Steve Bryant Mentalist

Steve Bryant knows what you're thinking! Really! Steve is a mentalist, or mindreader, if you prefer. Don't worry, he doesn't crawl inside your mind and steal all your thoughts, it's all in the name of fun and entertainment.

As a kid, Steve was always interested in magic, but didn't really know how to pursue that interest as a career. So, after obtaining a degree in radio-television-film, Steve went to work in radio and did weekend on-air stints as a disc jockey at KUDL-FM in Kansas City, which gave him the speaking experience he needed to get into performing and as luck would have it, he met a magician who really impressed Steve with his magic. That magician directed Steve to a local magic shop, where the proprietors introduced him, in turn, to the local magic club, Ring 129 of the International Brotherhood of Magicians.

At those club meetings Steve met others who shared his interest in magic, but more importantly, they shared their knowledge of the art and eventually five of them formed a performing group. Known as The Point Blank Mechanics, these men began plying their magic trade performing close up magic at area restaurants, going table to table to entertain restaurant guests. A couple of the Point Blank Mechanics moved away, but Steve and two others continued on and added the local Renaissance Festival to their work activity. Taking turns constantly through

the day at that festival helped polish Steve's stand up performance abilities, so he started seeking opportunities to perform stand up sets in front of larger groups.

From there, Steve ventured into corporate entertainment, and began performing for company events such as cocktail parties, annual meetings, and after dinner shows for such notable clients as The American Association of Family Practitioners, Marion Laboratories, and The Mid America Automated Clearing House Association. As more people saw Steve's work, the more he worked and his performances expanded to attracting prospective customers at trade shows, drawing passers-by into his clients' booth with his close up magic. Eventually, Steve's interest turned to mentalism – mindreading, thought reading, or if you'd rather look at it this way – the magic of the mind.

"My goal is to help companies create events that are impressive and unforgettable for their employees or customers. I always try to make my demonstrations both amazing and amusing"

Steve has been a featured performer at The Midwest Magic Jubilee, a convention attended by other magicians, and he has appeared on many local television shows. Currently, Steve works primarily for corporate clients, but still enjoys performing occasionally for private parties as well.

Mechanized system provides clean drinking water for 10,000 in Ghana

More than 10,000 people in three communities in Ghana are receiving safe drinking water from a mechanized system built through the efforts of the International H2O Collaboration, an alliance between Rotary International and USAID.

The water system is part of a \$2 million project providing boreholes, hand pumps, and mechanized pipes, as well as ventilated latrines and showers, across Ghana's Volta, Greater Accra, Eastern, and Central regions. "This project is a great example of public and private partnership at its very best, to improve not only the quality of life, but life itself, immeasurably," said Kalyan Banerjee.

He emphasized that to lose weight, it is not necessary to cut out your favorite foods. Instead, it is better to eat the right foods to feed the muscle and starve fat.
