The Young Against the Old: Generational Conflict, Past and Present

Speaker: Larry L. Welborn
Professor of Early Christianity, Fordham University, New York
Professor of Ancient History, Macquarie University, Sydney, Australia



Many of the conflicts around the world today are generational in character. The so-called "Arab Spring" began as an uprising among the youth in Tunisia; the protesters in Madrid's Buen Retiro Park took the name "los indignados" to express their outrage at an unemployment rate among youth in excess of 40 percent; the persons who were recently arrested in anti corruption protests in Russian cities were mainly young people; the "Umbrella Revolution" in Hong Kong is a pro-democracy demonstration by the young. Episodes of generational conflict in antiquity--in democratic Athens and republican Rome--have lessons to teach about the tensions and challenges of our present moment.
