

Katie Klain invited everyone to Bridges out of Poverty workshop on Friday February 21st presented by The Glen at St. Joseph.

President Jean Maychack turned the podium over to Jenny Lewis and she introduced our new member Nick Raines. Nick was a past Rotarian and happens to be Jenny's cousin.

Rick Schwartz presented a \$3,000.00 grant check on behalf of the Dayton Rotary Foundation to Junior Achievement. Jeff Brokamp, Senior VP of Education received the check.

Augusto, our foreign exchange student, gave us a quick update on what has been happening with him. He is involved in the robotics team and is mastering technology. He feels his English is improving and is very thankful for the club and his host families. He will give a more in-depth report at a later time.

Holly Wiggins gave us a rundown on the Dayton Rotary Service Opportunities and the Dayton Rotary Foundation. All of the foundation donations go straight to a 501c3. There are 4 types of funds for service they are funded by Day10's as well as earnings from the Dayton Foundations. The Quarter Grant Cycle – The grant can be up to \$3,000.00 and is approved by the board Signature Grants which are a one time grant and are paid out when we ...continued on page 4

have excess funds that have built up. District Grants are for local grants only. Our club applies to the district and they will match it 50/50. The amount is usually between 2k-10k with the max being 40K Disaster Relief Grants – We raised over 50K this past year. The current projects are Coats Plus Project, Youth Water Safety and the River Safety Locator Signage.


Cathy Ponitz, our Chair of the Day, introduced our presenter, Jane Snyder, who is the Development Director of Brigid's Path. After fostering several infants born exposed to addictive substances, Dayton mom and business owner Jill Kingston believed there had to be a better way of caring for children and families in the crisis of addiction. That belief led her to found Brigid's Path, the first newborn recovery center in Ohio and 2nd in the country.

Our primary work is to care for infants born exposed to an addictive substance like prescription medication, opioids or other drugs. We employ the latest therapeutic techniques – both medicinal and non-pharmacological – to help our babies be as comfortable as possible while they experience withdrawal. Our skilled medical staff and volunteers shower our babies with love and attention 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We respond immediately to a baby's every need, providing comfort and support at a crucial time of their development.

We also believe in the strength of families and that families can – and do – contribute to the successful treatment of our patients.

We work with community partners to provide resources for our moms to achieve the stability that will help them care for their children for both the near- and long-term. We encourage mothers to room with, care for, and bond with their babies as much as possible. From December 2017 through June 2019, our army of more than 139 volunteers logged more than 15,000 hours cuddling babies, washing laundry, staffing our front desk, clean our facility and more. We continue to have a wide variety of needs for volunteers, especially for cuddlers between 12 a.m. and 6 a.m.. For more information on Brigid's Path go to brigidspath.org.
